### A BILL ENTITLED

#### 1 AN ACT concerning

# Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners - System of Public School Buses Required

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners to 5 establish or contract for a system of public school buses to provide transportation for certain students in Baltimore City; prohibiting the Board 6 7 from providing or contracting for student transportation services in conjunction 8 with mass transit service provided to the general public in Baltimore City; 9 authorizing the Board to use a certain transportation grant only for certain 10 purposes; and generally relating to transportation services provided to certain students by the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners. 11

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

#### Article – Education

20 5-205.

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(a) The State shall distribute grants as provided under this section to the county boards to provide transportation services for public school students and disabled children for whom transportation is to be provided under § 8–410 of this article. Appropriations for student transportation shall be budgeted in a separate budget category as provided in § 5–101 of this title. If the amount that is appropriated to a county under this section in a fiscal year is more than the actual cost of providing

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student transportation services in that county, a county board may apply any excess funds to costs of pupil transportation in subsequent years. None of these funds may be paid to or claimed by any subdivision, nor may any of these funds be reverted to any subdivision. A county board may not transfer State revenues from the student transportation category to any other category as a result of this section.

8 (2)Subject to the limitations under paragraph (3) of this subsection, 9 for fiscal year 2004 and every year thereafter the amount of a county's base grant for student transportation shall be equal to the amount of the county's base grant for 10 11 student transportation for the previous year increased by the same percentage as the 12 increase in the private transportation category of the Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers, for the Washington-Baltimore metropolitan area, as of July of the 13 fiscal year preceding the year for which the amount is being calculated, plus an 14 15additional amount equal to the product of:

(i) The total amount of funds distributed by the State as base
grants for student transportation for the previous fiscal year divided by the statewide
full-time equivalent enrollment for the previous fiscal year; and

19 (ii) The difference between the full-time equivalent enrollment 20 in a county for the current fiscal year and the full-time equivalent enrollment in the 21 county for the previous fiscal year, or, if the full-time equivalent enrollment in a 22 county for the current fiscal year is less than the full-time equivalent enrollment in 23 the county for the previous fiscal year, zero.

24 (3) The increase in the amount of a base grant for student 25 transportation that is based on the increase in the private transportation category of 26 the Consumer Price Index may not be less than 3 percent nor more than 8 percent of 27 the amount of the grant for the previous year.

(d) For each fiscal year, in addition to the base grant for student transportation provided under subsection (c) of this section, a disabled student transportation grant shall be distributed to each county board. The amount of the grant to each board shall be equal to the product of the number of disabled students requiring special transportation services who are transported by the county board in the previous fiscal year and:

For the purposes of determining the amount of the grant provided under 4 (e) subsection (d) of this section, the State Board shall develop a procedure and adopt  $\mathbf{5}$ regulations for determining the number of disabled students transported in each 6 7 jurisdiction in the previous fiscal year. 8 **(F)** IN BALTIMORE CITY, THE BALTIMORE CITY BOARD OF SCHOOL 9 **COMMISSIONERS:** 10 (1) SHALL ESTABLISH OR CONTRACT FOR A SYSTEM OF PUBLIC 11 SCHOOL **BUSES** TO PROVIDE STUDENT TRANSPORTATION **SERVICES** 12EXCLUSIVELY FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS AND DISABLED CHILDREN FOR 13WHOM TRANSPORTATION IS TO BE PROVIDED UNDER § 8-410 OF THIS ARTICLE; 14 **(2)** MAY NOT, IN CONJUNCTION WITH MASS TRANSIT SERVICE 15THAT IS PROVIDED TO THE GENERAL PUBLIC IN BALTIMORE CITY, PROVIDE OR 16 CONTRACT FOR STUDENT TRANSPORTATION SERVICES FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL 17STUDENTS AND DISABLED CHILDREN FOR WHOM TRANSPORTATION IS TO BE 18 **PROVIDED UNDER § 8–410 OF THIS ARTICLE; AND** 19 (3) MAY USE THE GRANT FOR STUDENT TRANSPORTATION 20PROVIDED UNDER THIS SECTION ONLY FOR THE PURPOSES SPECIFIED IN 21PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION. 22[(f)] (G)The State Board shall adopt rules and regulations that provide for 23the safe operation of the student transportation system of each county board of  $\mathbf{24}$ education.
