1 WHEREAS, Smith Island has its own traditional cuisine, which includes its $\mathbf{2}$ most famous dish - Smith Island cake; and 3 WHEREAS, Smith Island cake features eight to ten thin layers of cake separated by rich frosting, and is most commonly served as a yellow cake with 4 5 chocolate icing, but also is made in other flavors like coconut, fig, and strawberry; and 6 WHEREAS, Smith Island cake has been served for generations at holidays, 7 special events, and church dinners; and 8 WHEREAS, Smith Island cake is a unique State tradition; now, therefore, 9 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 10 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 11 **Article – State Government** 1213-320. 13SMITH ISLAND CAKE IS THE STATE DESSERT. SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 14
