1 AN ACT concerning

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Maryland Funding Accountability and Transparency Act of 2008

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Budget and Management to develop 4 and operate a specified certain website that includes specified certain information for certain State financial assistance and expenditures payments; 5 6 specifying certain parameters of the website; authorizing the Secretary of 7 Budget and Management to designate certain agencies to participate in the development, operation, or support of the website; authorizing the Secretary to 8 9 determine the best and most appropriate data sources for the website requiring the Chief of Information Technology in the Department of Budget and 10 Management to conduct a certain study on expanding or replacing a certain 11 website; providing for the termination of certain provisions of this Act; defining 12 certain terms; providing that certain provisions of law may not be construed to 13 require the disclosure of certain confidential information; and generally relating 14 to a searchable website to be developed and operated by the Department of 15 Budget and Management to provide information to the public on State financial 16 17 assistance and expenditures payments.
