A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Motor Vehicles – Use of Text Messaging Device While Driving – Prohibition**

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from using a text messaging device to write,
4 send, or read a text message while operating a motor vehicle.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 **Article – Transportation**

18 **21–1124.1.**

19 **A PERSON MAY NOT USE A TEXT MESSAGING DEVICE TO WRITE, SEND, OR**
20 **READ A TEXT MESSAGE WHILE OPERATING A MOTOR VEHICLE.**

21 27–101.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

[Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



1 (a) It is a misdemeanor for any person to violate any of the provisions of the
2 Maryland Vehicle Law unless the violation:

3 (1) Is declared to be a felony by the Maryland Vehicle Law or by any
4 other law of this State; or

5 (2) Is punishable by a civil penalty under the applicable provision of
6 the Maryland Vehicle Law.

7 (b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, any person convicted of a
8 misdemeanor for the violation of any of the provisions of the Maryland Vehicle Law is
9 subject to a fine of not more than \$500.

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
11 October 1, 2008.
