BY adding to Article – Labor and Employment Section 8-607.1 Annotated Code of Maryland (1999 Replacement Volume and 2007 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
