A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Health Occupations - Power of Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene - Regulatory Boards

FOR the purpose of altering the power of the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene to include the power to disapprove or modify decisions or determinations of certain regulatory boards regarding disciplinary action against individuals licensed or certified by the boards; and generally relating to the power of the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene over regulatory boards.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 (a) [The] EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (B) OF 19 THIS SECTION, THE power of the Secretary over plans, proposals, and projects of 20 units in the Department does not include the power to disapprove or modify any 21 decision or determination that a board or commission established under this article 22 makes under authority specifically delegated by law to the board or commission.

23(B) THE SECRETARY MAY DISAPPROVE OR MODIFY ANY DECISION OR24DETERMINATION THAT A BOARD ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS ARTICLE MAKES

3 [(b)] (C) The power of the Secretary to transfer staff or functions of units in 4 the Department does not apply to any staff of a board or commission, established 5 under this article, or to any functions that pertain to licensing, disciplinary, or 6 enforcement authority, or to any other authority specifically delegated by law to a 7 board or commission.

8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 9 October 1, 2008.
