Harford County – Alcoholic Beverages – Cafe License

- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing in Harford County a Class B Cafe beer and wine 4 license; specifying an annual license fee; specifying that the license entitles the holder to sell beer and wine for consumption on and off the premises; specifying $\mathbf{5}$ 6 that the license is a 7-day license with an on-premises wine tasting privilege 7 for a certain number of days; prohibiting the Liquor Control Board from issuing 8 more than a certain number of cafe licenses; requiring the Liquor Control Board 9 to set a maximum and a minimum seating capacity for certain licenses; authorizing the license to be issued only if certain conditions are met; 10 prohibiting the license from being used for certain purposes; specifying certain 11 hours and days of sale; and generally relating to a Class B Cafe beer and wine 12 13 license in Harford County.
