A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **State Real Estate Commission – Investigative Staff – Employment and**
3 **Payment**

4 FOR the purpose of repealing the requirement that certain investigative staff of the
5 State Real Estate Commission be employed in accordance with the State
6 budget; requiring the Commission to pay certain investigative staff from the
7 State Real Estate Commission Fund, subject to certain conditions; providing
8 that certain investigative staff may not be subject to certain hiring moratoriums
9 or certain PIN eliminations; and generally relating to the employment and
10 payment of investigative staff of the State Real Estate Commission.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 **Article – Business Occupations and Professions**

19 17–206.

20 (b) (1) The Commission[, in accordance with the State budget,] may
21 employ an investigative staff to conduct investigations.

22 (2) **SUBJECT TO THE AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS IN THE STATE**
23 **REAL ESTATE COMMISSION FUND ESTABLISHED UNDER § 2–106.3 OF THE**

1 **BUSINESS REGULATION ARTICLE, THE COMMISSION SHALL PAY**

3 **(3) INVESTIGATIVE STAFF EMPLOYED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF**
4 **THIS SUBSECTION AND PAID UNDER PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION MAY**
5 **NOT BE SUBJECT TO HIRING MORATORIUMS OR PIN ELIMINATIONS.**

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
7 October 1, 2008.
