19	MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:									

20 Article - State Personnel and Pensions

21 24-403.

(a) This section applies only to a retiree who has retired with a serviceretirement allowance or a disability retirement allowance.

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1 (b) On the death of a retiree, the Board of Trustees shall pay [50%] **80%** of 2 the retiree's retirement allowance:

- 3
- (1) to the surviving spouse; or

4 (2) if there is not a surviving spouse or if the surviving spouse dies 5 before the youngest child is 18 years old, to any children of the deceased retiree who 6 are under 18 years of age.

7 (c) If the Board of Trustees pays an allowance to more than one child, the 8 Board of Trustees shall divide the allowance among the children under the age of 18 9 years in a manner that provides for payments to continue until each child dies or 10 becomes 18 years old.

(a) Subject to subsections (b) through (d) of this section, the Board of
Trustees shall pay the following benefits in accordance with Title II of the federal
Social Security Act:

15 (1) if a member dies while employed as a member, child's insurance16 benefits;

17 (2) if a retiree dies with a special disability retirement allowance 18 under § 29–111 of this article:

- 19 (i) surviving spouse's insurance benefits;
- 20 (ii) child's insurance benefits; or
- 21 (iii) parents' insurance benefits; or
- (3) if a retiree dies with a service retirement allowance or an ordinary
 disability retirement allowance under § 29–107 of this article:
- 24 (i) surviving spouse's insurance benefits;
- 25 (ii) child's insurance benefits;
- 26 (iii) mother's insurance benefits;
- 27 (iv) parents' insurance benefits; or
- 28 (v) other death benefits payable under Title II of the federal
 29 Social Security Act.

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1 (b) A payment under subsection (a)(1) or (2) of this section may not be made 2 if, under Title II of the federal Social Security Act:

3 (1) the surviving spouse is eligible to receive surviving spouse's 4 insurance benefits;

- 5 (2) the child is eligible to receive child's insurance benefits; or
- 6 (3) the parent is eligible to receive parents' insurance benefits.
- 7 (c) The Board of Trustees shall make a payment under this section:
- 8 (1) after receiving proof of death of the member or retiree;
- 9 (2) in accordance with Title II of the federal Social Security Act in 10 effect at the time of initial eligibility; and
- 11 (3) without any cost-of-living adjustment that the federal government12 may provide.
- 13 (d) The monthly earnings used in the federal Social Security Act14 computation of benefits under this section shall be the lesser of:
- 15 (1) one-twelfth of the member's average final compensation; or
- 16 (2) the maximum Social Security monthly earnings that may be used17 in the computation.]
- 18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect19 July 1, 2008.
