- (12) three representatives of organizations currently contracting with 1 2 the State to provide health or social services, appointed by the Governor. 3 The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House jointly shall designate the chair of the Task Force. 4 (d) The Task Force may establish subcommittees as it determines necessary 5 6 to fulfill its duties. The Department of Budget and Management and the Department of 7 General Services Department of Legislative Services departments represented on the 8 *Task Force* shall provide staff for the Task Force. 9 10 (f) A member of the Task Force: 11 (1) may not receive compensation as a member of the Task Force; but 12 (2)is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget. 13 14 The Task Force shall: (g) 15 evaluate and make recommendations regarding the methods used by State agencies to procure the delivery of health and social services; 16 17 (2)examine and make recommendations regarding State agencies' timeliness in preparing and issuing requests for proposals for the delivery of health 18 19 and human services: 20 (3)examine and make recommendations regarding the timeliness of 21payments to contractors; 22(4) examine and make recommendations regarding possible 23standardization of contracting processes among and within State agencies, including standardization of related documents and documentation required of contractors; and 2425 identify and make recommendations regarding any other issues, including current State laws or regulations affecting the efficiency and cost of 26 procuring health and social services. 27 28 In evaluating processes and formulating recommendations, the Task 29 Force shall especially consider:
- 30 (1) the effect of procurement processes on quality and continuity of 31 services;

2 3	(3) the effects of procurement requirements on the number and diversity of potential providers of services contracted by the State.
4 5 6	(i) The Task Force shall report its preliminary findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly on or before November 30, 2008.
7 8 9	(j) The Task Force shall report its final findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly on or before November 30, 2009.
10 11 12 13	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2008. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June 30, 2010, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
