16 17 18	WHEREAS, Many factors contributing to crippling or fatal injuries, asthma obesity, and other health problems of children and youth are associated with environmental or behavioral risk factors; and
19	WHEREAS, Reliable data on risk factors contributing to child and adolescent
20	deaths and illnesses enable public health personnel to develop programs to mitigate
21	these factors; and
22	WHEREAS, The United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention
23	have created the Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance System (YRBSS), which is a tool to
24	measure these factors and to monitor the effectiveness of risk reduction programs; and

1	WHEREAS, The United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention
2	recommend the use of passive consent for the administration of the YRBSS survey, in
3	order to obtain a completely representative and statistically valid number of survey
4	participants; now, therefore,

5 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 6 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 9 (a) The Department shall establish procedures for the administration of the 10 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance System 11 survey.
- 12 (b) The Department may omit up to a maximum of one-third of the survey questions if the Department considers the content of the questions inappropriate.
- 14 (c) (1) The Department shall require a local school system to [obtain parental consent using a parental consent form] UTILIZE PASSIVE PARENTAL CONSENT before administering the survey.
- 17 (2) The [parental consent form shall include] LOCAL SCHOOL 18 SYSTEM SHALL PROVIDE EACH PARENT WITH:
- (I) [a] A statement that explains how a parent can obtain a copy of the survey questions that will be administered and more information regarding the survey, including the mailing address, telephone number, and website address of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention; AND
- 23 (II) A DENIAL OF PERMISSION FORM THAT MAY BE 24 RETURNED BY THE PARENT TO THE SCHOOL.
- 25 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 26 October 1, 2008.
