- FOR the purpose of requiring the State Department of Education to require local school systems to utilize passive parental consent before administering a certain survey; requiring local school systems to provide parents with certain statements and forms; requiring certain forms to be part of a certain card that
 requests certain information in certain years; and generally relating to the administration of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance System survey in the public schools of the State.

WHEREAS, Many factors contributing to crippling or fatal injuries, asthma,
obesity, and other health problems of children and youth are associated with
environmental or behavioral risk factors; and

WHEREAS, Reliable data on risk factors contributing to child and adolescent deaths and illnesses enable public health personnel to develop programs to mitigate these factors; and

1 WHEREAS, The United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention 2 have created the Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance System (YRBSS), which is a tool to 3 measure these factors and to monitor the effectiveness of risk reduction programs; and

WHEREAS, The United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommend the use of passive consent for the administration of the YRBSS survey, in order to obtain a completely representative and statistically valid number of survey participants; now, therefore,

8 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 9 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

(a) The Department shall establish procedures for the administration of the
 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance System
 survey.

15 (b) The Department may omit up to a maximum of one-third of the survey 16 questions if the Department considers the content of the questions inappropriate.

(c) (1) The Department shall require a local school system to [obtain
 parental consent using a parental consent form] UTILIZE PASSIVE PARENTAL
 CONSENT before administering the survey.

20(2)The [parental consent form shall include]LOCAL SCHOOL21SYSTEM SHALL PROVIDE EACH PARENT WITH:

22**(I)** [a] A statement that explains: 23**NOTIFIES THE PARENT THAT:** 1. 24А. THE SURVEY IS CONFIDENTIAL; 25**B**. THE ANSWERS WILL BE KEPT PRIVATE; 26 **C**.
