Dorchester County - Alcoholic Beverages Act of 2008

3 FOR the purpose of repealing the off-sale privilege of a Class B beer and light wine 4 license in Dorchester County on and after a certain date; authorizing a holder of 5 a Class B (on-sale and off-sale) beer and light wine license in Dorchester 6 County that is issued on or before a certain date to continue to exercise the 7 privileges of the license and to renew the license; prohibiting the Board of 8 License Commissioners from approving the transfer of a certain license on or 9 before a certain date; repealing a requirement that a holder of a certain license must purchase wine from the Dorchester County Liquor Control Board 10 11 Dispensaries; clarifying that certain restaurants may obtain a certain license from the Board of License Commissioners; clarifying that a certain license 12 provides for the consumption of beer, wine, and liquor; providing certain 13 14 penalties for the violation of certain requirements regarding catering events; authorizing the issuance of Class A beer and wine licenses for certain premises 15 under certain circumstances; altering the hours of sale for certain licenses; and 16 17 generally relating to alcoholic beverages in Dorchester County.

This license entitles the licensee to sell beer, wines, and liquors.
