A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Elections - Voting Interference - Misuse of Telephone Facilities and Electronic Mail

4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting the use of electronic mail or telephone facilities or equipment with the intent to prevent, obstruct, or delay the broadcast or 5 exchange of certain registration information or the registration of a person 6 having a lawful right to register; prohibiting the use of electronic mail or 7 telephone facilities or equipment with the intent to prevent, obstruct, or delay 8 9 the broadcast or exchange of election related information, or the use of a 10 telecommunications device to engage in certain communication; making certain 11 conforming changes; defining certain terms; and generally relating to voting interference. 12

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
