T.R.A. Act of 2008

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Department of Education to adopt regulations 4 that provide certain standards that a family day care home with a swimming 5 pool must meet; requiring each family day care home with a swimming pool to 6 meet certain requirements; establishing certain standards for fences, gates, alarms, covers, and steps for swimming pools at family day care homes; 7 8 requiring a certain number of adults with CPR training to be present when 9 family day care children are using the swimming pool; requiring a family day 10 care provider whose family day care home has a swimming pool to obtain 11 certain insurance coverage; and generally relating to family day care homes with swimming pools. 12

- 23 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 24 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 4 5	(b) So far as practicable, the regulations shall be uniform with the rules and regulations adopted by other State agencies as those rules and regulations relate to other types of day care.		
6	(c) At a minimum, the regulations of the Department shall provide for:		
7 8	(1) minimum standards of environmental health and safety, including provisions for:		
9	(i) adequate and safe physical surroundings;		
10	(ii) the physical and mental health of day care providers; and		
11	(iii) investigation of any criminal record of a day care provider;		
12 13 14	(2) a thorough evaluation of each prospective family day care home and day care provider, to be completed before the Department accepts an initial registration;		
15 16	(3) an initial family day care registration that expires 2 years after its effective date;		
17	(4) a continuing family day care registration that:		
18 19 20	(i) upon application by the day care provider that meets the requirements set by the Department, is issued to the provider before the end of the initial registration period; and		
21 22	(ii) once issued, remains in effect until surrendered, suspended, revoked, or replaced by a conditional registration;		
23 24	(5) reporting of any changed circumstances that relate to the requirements, by the day care provider, at the time the change occurs;		
25 26	(6) an orientation to be provided to prospective day care providers by the Department before initial registration;		
27 28 29 30	(7) announced inspection by the Department of each registered family day care home prior to issuance of an initial registration and at least once every 2 years thereafter to determine whether applicable requirements, including record keeping requirements, are being met;

family day care home at least once during each 12-month period that an initial or

continuing registration is in effect to determine whether safe and appropriate child 1 $\mathbf{2}$ care is being provided; 3 procedures to be followed by the Department in response to a 4 complaint about a family day care home; 5 a requirement that a person who advertises a family day care 6 home or family day care service shall: 7 indicate in the advertisement that the family day care home (i) 8 is registered; and 9 (ii) display in the advertisement the registration number issued to the family day care home or family day care service by the Department; 10 11 a requirement that each registered day care provider shall hold a 12 current certificate indicating successful completion of approved: 13 basic first aid training through the American Red Cross or 14 through a program with equivalent standards; and cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) training through the 15 (ii) American Heart Association or through a program with equivalent standards 16 17 appropriate for the ages of children for whom care is provided in the family day care 18 home; [and] 19 (12)(i) a requirement that a family day care home that receives 20 notice of a contaminated drinking water supply from the family day care home's supplier of water, in accordance with § 9–410 of the Environment Article or otherwise, 2122send notice of the drinking water contamination to the parent or legal guardian of 23 each child attending the family day care home; and 24(ii) a requirement that the notice sent by the family day care 25 home shall: 26 1. be sent within 10 business days after receipt of the notice of contamination from the family day care home's water supplier; 2728 2. be in writing; 29 3. identify the contaminants and their levels in the family day care home's water supply; and 30 31 describe the family day care home's plan for dealing 4. 32 with the water contamination problem until the family day care home's water is

- 5 (A) EACH FAMILY DAY CARE HOME WITH A SWIMMING POOL SHALL 6 MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION.
- 7 (B) (1) THE SWIMMING POOL AT A FAMILY DAY CARE HOME SHALL:
- 8 (I) BE SURROUNDED BY A FENCE WITH A GATE THAT IS SELF-CLOSING, SELF-LATCHING, AND LOCKED WHEN THE POOL IS NOT IN USE;
- 10 (II) HAVE AN ALARM TO DETECT MOTION IN THE POOL; AND
- 11 (III) BE COVERED DURING THE OFF-SEASON.

- 13 ABOVE-GROUND POOL, THE FAMILY DAY CARE PROVIDER SHALL ENSURE THAT

- 20 CPR-TRAINED ADULTS TO FAMILY DAY CARE CHILDREN.
- 21 (3) THE REQUIREMENT OF PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION
- 22 IS IN ADDITION TO ANY OTHER REQUIREMENT THAT A FAMILY DAY CARE
- 23 PROVIDER HAVE CARDIOPULMONARY RESUSCITATION (CPR) TRAINING.
- 24 (D) IN ADDITION TO ANY EXISTING HOMEOWNER'S INSURANCE

- 27 OBTAIN INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR LIABILITY THAT RESULTS FROM BODILY
