- 1 (c) (1) Portions of the Rate Stabilization Account that exceed the amount 2 necessary to pay for health care provider subsidies shall remain in the Rate 3 Stabilization Account to be used:

- 9 (2) Any disbursements from the Rate Stabilization Account to a medical professional liability insurer that is not used to provide a rate reduction, credit, or refund to a health care provider shall be returned to the State Treasurer for reversion to the Fund.
- 13 (3) Notwithstanding paragraph (1) of this subsection, amounts 14 necessary to pay for health care provider subsidies under § 19–805(b)(3) of this subtitle shall remain in the Rate Stabilization Account.
- 16 (E) NOTWITHSTANDING SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION OR ANY
 17 OTHER PROVISION OF LAW, IN FISCAL YEAR 2009, \$83,275,000 OF THE BALANCE
 18 REMAINING IN THE RATE STABILIZATION ACCOUNT AT THE END OF FISCAL
 19 YEAR 2008 SHALL BE TRANSFERRED TO THE REVENUE STABILIZATION
 20 ACCOUNT ESTABLISHED UNDER § 7–311 OF THE STATE FINANCE AND
