A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Business Regulation - Maryland Real Estate Brokers Act - Violations and Penalties

4 FOR the purpose of altering the maximum penalties that may be imposed by a court or 5 the State Real Estate Commission for certain violations of the Marvland Real 6 Estate Brokers Act; altering the provisions of the Maryland Real Estate Brokers 7 Act, a violation of which is subject to certain criminal penalties; providing that a 8 person who violates the Maryland Real Estate Brokers Act is subject to certain 9 provisions regarding statute of limitations and in banc review; and generally 10 relating to violations and penalties under the Maryland Real Estate Brokers 11 Act.

- 22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 23 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
 - **Article Business Occupations and Professions**
- 25 17–530.

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(a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

2 (2) "Buyer's agent" means a licensed real estate broker, licensed 3 associate real estate broker, or licensed real estate salesperson who represents a 4 prospective buyer or lessee in the acquisition of real estate for sale or for lease.

- 5 (3) "Cooperating agent" means a licensed real estate broker, licensed 6 associate real estate broker, or licensed real estate salesperson who:
- (i) is not affiliated with or is not acting as the listing real estate
 broker for a property; and
- 9 (ii) assists a prospective buyer or lessee as a subagent of the 10 listing real estate broker, in the acquisition of real estate for sale or for lease.

11 (4) "Intra-company agent" means a licensed associate real estate 12 broker or licensed real estate salesperson who has been designated by the real estate 13 broker who the associate real estate broker or licensed real estate salesperson is 14 affiliated with to act as a dual agent on behalf of a seller or lessor or buyer or lessee in 15 the purchase, sale, or lease of real estate that is listed with the real estate broker.

16 (5) "Dual agent" means a licensed real estate broker, licensed 17 associate real estate broker, or licensed real estate salesperson who acts as an agent 18 for both the seller and the buyer or the lessor and the lessee in the same real estate 19 transaction.

20 (6) "Seller's agent" means a licensed real estate broker, licensed 21 associate real estate broker, or licensed real estate salesperson who:

(i) is affiliated with or acts as the listing broker for real estate;and

24 (ii) assists a prospective buyer or lessee in the acquisition of real
25 estate for sale or for lease.

- (b) (1) A licensee who participates in a residential real estate transaction
 as a seller's agent, buyer's agent, or as a cooperating agent shall disclose in writing
 that the licensee represents the seller or lessor or the buyer or lessee.
- 29 (2) The disclosure shall occur not later than the first scheduled
 30 face-to-face contact with the seller or lessor or the buyer or lessee.
- 31 (3) (i) In any residential real estate transaction involving a 32 cooperating agent as defined in this section, it shall be the obligation of the 33 cooperating agent to make the written disclosure to the buyer or lessee required under 34 this section.

1 (ii) In any residential real estate transaction that does not 2 involve a cooperating agent as defined in this section, it shall be the obligation of the 3 seller's agent, as defined in this section, to make the written disclosure to the buyer or 4 lessee required under this section.

5 (4) In any residential real estate transaction involving a buyer's agent, 6 it shall be the obligation of the buyer's agent to make the written disclosure to the 7 seller or lessor or the agent of the seller or lessor as required under this section.

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- (5) The written disclosure shall explain:

9 (i) the differences between a seller's agent, buyer's agent, 10 cooperating agent, dual agent, and intra-company agent;

(ii) the duties of a licensee to exercise reasonable care and
 diligence and maintain confidentiality;

(iii) that a licensee who assists a buyer or lessee in locating residential real estate for purchase or lease and is neither affiliated with nor acting as the listing real estate broker for any real estate shown or located, is presumed to be acting as a buyer's agent on behalf of the prospective buyer or lessee, unless either the licensee or the prospective buyer or lessee expressly declines to have the licensee act as a buyer's agent;

19 (iv) that regardless of whom a licensee represents in a real 20 estate transaction, the licensee has a duty to treat each party fairly, promptly present 21 each written offer and counteroffer, respond truthfully to each question, disclose all 22 material facts that are known or should be known relating to a property, and offer 23 each property without discrimination;

24 (v) that a licensee is qualified to advise only on real estate 25 matters and that legal or tax advice should be obtained from a licensed attorney or 26 accountant;

(vi) the need for an agreement with a seller's agent, buyer's
agent, or dual agent to be in writing and to include the duties and obligations of the
agent, how and by whom the agent will be compensated, and any fee-sharing
arrangements with other agents;

31 (vii) the duty of a buyer's agent to assist in the:

32 1. evaluation of a property, including the provision of a
 33 market analysis of the property; and

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35 in the best interests of the buyer;

1 (viii) the possibility that a dual agency may arise in a real estate 2 transaction and the options that would become available to the buyer and seller or 3 lessee and lessor; and

4 (ix) that any complaints concerning a licensee may be filed with 5 the State Real Estate Commission.

6 (c) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (d) of this section, a licensed 7 real estate broker, licensed associate real estate broker, or licensed real estate 8 salesperson may not act as a dual agent in this State.

9 (d) (1) (i) If a licensed real estate broker or a designee of the real 10 estate broker obtains the written informed consent of all parties to a real estate 11 transaction, the real estate broker may act as a dual agent in the transaction.

12 (ii) When acting as a dual agent in a real estate transaction, a 13 real estate broker or a designee of the real estate broker shall assign a licensed 14 associate real estate broker or licensed real estate salesperson affiliated with the real 15 estate broker to act as the intra-company agent on behalf of the seller or lessor and 16 another licensed associate real estate broker or licensed real estate salesperson 17 affiliated with the real estate broker to act as the intra-company agent on behalf of 18 the buyer or lessee.

(iii) 1. Except as otherwise required by this title and except
to the intra-company agent's real estate broker or a designee of the real estate broker,
an intra-company agent may not disclose information that a seller or buyer in a real
estate transaction requests to remain confidential.

23 2. Except as otherwise required by this title, the real 24 estate broker or the designee of the real estate broker acting as the dual agent may 25 not disclose confidential information to the buyer or seller or the buyer's or seller's 26 intra-company agent in the same real estate transaction.

(iv) If a real estate broker offers any financial bonuses to
licensees affiliated with the broker for the sale or lease of real property listed with the
real estate broker, the real estate broker shall provide to each party to a real estate
transaction a statement that discloses that financial bonuses are offered.

(v) An intra-company agent representing the seller or buyer may provide the same services to the client as an exclusive agent for the seller or buyer, including advising the client as to price and negotiation strategy, provided that the intra-company agent has made the appropriate disclosures to the client and the client has consented, as required by this section, to dual agency representation.

(vi) The provisions of the services specified in this subsection
may not be construed to be a breach of duty of the licensee, provided that the licensee
has complied with the duties specified in § 17–522 of this subtitle.

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(2)1 The written consent shall identify each property for which the real $\mathbf{2}$ estate broker will serve as a dual agent. The written consent shall include a statement that: 3 (3)the real estate broker receives compensation on the sale of a 4 (i) property listed only by the broker; 5 6 as a dual agent the real estate broker represents both the (ii) 7 seller and the buyer and there may be a conflict of interest because the interests of the seller and the buyer may be different or adverse; 8 9 as a dual agent the real estate broker does not owe (iii) undivided loyalty to either the seller or the buver; 10 11 except as otherwise required by this title, a dual agent may (iv)12not disclose information that a seller or buyer in a real estate transaction requests to 13remain confidential to the buyer or seller in the same real estate transaction; 14 unless authorized by the seller, a dual agent may not tell a (**v**) buyer that the seller will accept a price lower than the listing price or accept terms 15other than those contained in the listing agreement or suggest that the seller accept a 16 17lower price in the presence of the buyer; 18 unless authorized by the buyer, a dual agent may not tell a (vi)19 seller that the buyer is willing to pay a price higher than the price the buyer offered or 20accept terms other than those contained in the offer of the buyer or suggest that the buyer pay a higher price in the presence of the seller; 2122a dual agent may not disclose the motivation of a buyer or (vii) 23seller or the need or urgency of a seller to sell or a buyer to buy; $\mathbf{24}$ (viii) except as otherwise required by this title, if the information is confidential, a dual agent may not disclose any facts that lead the seller to sell; 2526 (ix) the buyer or seller does not have to consent to the dual 27agency; 28the buyer or seller has voluntarily consented to the dual (**x**) 29agency; and the terms of the dual agency are understood by the buyer or 30 (xi) 31seller. 32A cause of action may not arise against a licensee for (4)(i) disclosure of the dual agency relationship as provided by this section. 33

1 (ii) A dual agent does not terminate any brokerage relationship 2 by making any required disclosure of dual agency.

3 (5) (i) In any residential real estate transaction, a licensee may 4 withdraw from representing a client who refuses to consent to a disclosed dual agency 5 and to terminate the brokerage relationship with the client.

6 (ii) The withdrawal may not prejudice the ability of the licensee 7 to continue to represent the other client in the transaction, nor to limit the licensee 8 from representing the client who refused the dual agency in other transactions not 9 involving dual agency.

10 (e) (1) The State Real Estate Commission shall require a licensed real 11 estate broker, licensed associate real estate broker, or licensed real estate salesperson 12 who participates in a residential real estate transaction to utilize a standard 13 disclosure form in each real estate transaction that includes the information specified 14 in subsection (b)(5) of this section.

15 (2) The State Real Estate Commission shall require a licensed real 16 estate broker who acts as a dual agent and a licensed real estate associate broker or 17 licensed real estate salesperson who acts as an intra-company agent in a real estate 18 transaction to utilize a standard consent form that includes the information specified 19 in subsection (d)(3) of this section.

- 20 (f) (1) The State Real Estate Commission shall prepare and provide a 21 copy of:
- (i) the standard disclosure form required under subsection (b)
 of this section to each licensee in this State; and
- 24 (ii) the standard consent form required under subsection (d) of 25 this section to each licensee in this State.
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- (2) The disclosure form and the consent form shall be:
- 27 (i) written in a clear and coherent manner using words with
 28 common and everyday meanings;
- 29 (ii) appropriately divided and captioned by their various30 sections; and
- 31 (iii) printed in at least 10 point type.

(a) In this section, "client" includes a prospective buyer or lessee under a
 presumed buyer's agency relationship or a presumed lessee's agency relationship as
 described in § 17–533 of this subtitle.

A licensee shall comply with the provisions of this section when providing 1 (b) $\mathbf{2}$ real estate brokerage services. 3 (c) (1)A licensee shall: 4 (i) act in accordance with the terms of the brokerage 5 agreement; 6 (ii) promote the interests of the client by: 7 1. seeking a sale or lease of real estate at a price or rent 8 specified in the brokerage agreement or at a price or rent acceptable to the client; 2. 9 seeking a sale or lease of real estate on terms specified in the brokerage agreement or on terms acceptable to the client; and 10 11 3. unless otherwise specified in the brokerage agreement, presenting in a timely manner all written offers or counteroffers to and 12from the client, even if the real estate is subject to an existing contract of sale or lease; 13 14 disclose to the client all material facts as required under § (iii) 1517–322 of this title: 16 (iv) treat all parties to the transaction honestly and fairly and 17answer all questions truthfully; in a timely manner account for all trust money received; 18 (**v**) (vi) exercise reasonable care and diligence; and 19 20 (vii) comply with all: 211. requirements of this title; 222. applicable federal, State, and local fair housing laws 23and regulations; and 3. 24other applicable laws and regulations. Unless the client consents in writing to the disclosure, a licensee 25(2)may not disclose confidential information received from or about a client to any other 2627party or licensee acting as the agent of that party or other representative of that party. Unless the client to whom the confidential information relates 28(3)29 consents in writing to a disclosure of that confidential information, a licensee who

receives confidential information from or about the licensee's own past or present
