## A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning

## Teachers' Pension System - Ineligible Positions - Transferring Membership

FOR the purpose of requiring certain members of the Teachers' Pension System to transfer to the Employees' Pension System under certain circumstances; allowing certain members of the Teachers' Pension System the choice of whether to transfer to the Employees' Pension System or a local pension system; requiring certain members of the Teachers' Pension System to make certain choices at a certain time; requiring certain employers of certain members of the Teachers' Pension System to make certain contributions to the Board of Trustees of the State Retirement and Pension System on behalf of the members; clarifying that certain provisions of law apply to certain transfers of certain members of the Teachers' Pension System to a local pension system; providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to members of the Teachers' Pension System who are promoted or transferred to positions that are not eligible for participation in the Teachers' Pension System.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - State Personnel and Pensions
23-202.1.
(A) A nonfaculty employee of the Baltimore City Community College who is a member of the Teachers' Pension System on October 1, 2002 may transfer membership to the Employees' Pension System on or before December 31, 2002.
(B) (1) THIS SUBSECTION APPLIES TO AN INDIVIDUAL WHO:
(I) IS A MEMBER OF THE TEACHERS' PENSION System; AND
(II) IS PROMOTED OR TRANSFERRED TO A POSITION THAT IS NOT ELIGIBLE FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE TEACHERS' PENSION SYSTEM BUT IS ELIGIBLE FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE EMPLOYEES' PENSION SYSTEM.
(2) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (3) OF THIS SUBSECTION, AN INDIVIDUAL DESCRIBED IN PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION SHALL TRANSFER MEMBERSHIP TO THE EMPLOYEES' PENSION SYSTEM AT THE TIME THE INDIVIDUAL IS PROMOTED OR TRANSFERRED.
(3) (I) 1. AN INDIVIDUAL DESCRIBED IN PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION WHO IS EMPLOYED BY A PARTICIPATING EMPLOYER THAT HAS ESTABLISHED A LOCAL PENSION SYSTEM FOR WHICH THE INDIVIDUAL EMPLOYED IN THE NEW POSITION WOULD QUALIFY SHALL CHOOSE WHETHER TO TRANSFER MEMBERSHIP TO THE EMPLOYEES' PENSION SYSTEM OR THE LOCAL PENSION SYSTEM.
2. AN INDIVIDUAL SHALL CHOOSE WHETHER TO TRANSFER MEMBERSHIP TO THE EMPLOYEES' PENSION SYSTEM OR THE LOCAL PENSION SYSTEM AT THE TIME THE MEMBER IS PROMOTED OR TRANSFERRED.
(II) IF AN INDIVIDUAL CHOOSES TO TRANSFER MEMBERSHIP TO THE EMPLOYEES' PENSION SYSTEM, EACH YEAR THE INDIVIDUAL'S EMPLOYER SHALL PAY TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES ON BEHALF OF THE INDIVIDUAL AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO THE EMPLOYER CONTRIBUTION RATE IN EFFECT FOR STATE EMPLOYEES PARTICIPATING IN THE EMPLOYEES' PENSION SYSTEM.
(III) IF AN INDIVIDUAL CHOOSES TO TRANSFER MEMBERSHIP TO THE INDIVIDUAL'S LOCAL PENSION SYSTEM, TITLE 37 OF THIS ARTICLE SHALL APPLY.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be construed to apply only prospectively and many not be applied or interpreted to have any effect on or application to any individual who on or before June 30, 2008, is a member of the Teachers' Pension System and employed in a position not eligible for participation in the Teachers' Pension System.

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SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2008.
