1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Education - Public School Employees - Criminal Convictions**

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a county board of education from knowingly hiring or
4 retaining certain employees who have been convicted of certain crimes; and
5 generally relating to the employment of individuals convicted of qualifying
6 crimes in Maryland public schools.

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article - Education**

15 6-113.

16 [The State Board shall adopt regulations that prohibit a county board from
17 knowingly hiring, as a noncertificated employee,] **A COUNTY BOARD MAY NOT**
18 **KNOWINGLY HIRE OR RETAIN** any individual who has been convicted of a crime
19 involving:

1 (1) An offense under § 3–307 of the Criminal Law Article;

2 (2) Child sexual abuse under § 3–602 of the Criminal Law Article, or
3 an offense under the laws of another state that would constitute child sexual abuse
4 under § 3–602 of the Criminal Law Article if committed in this State; or

5 (3) A crime of violence as defined in § 14–101 of the Criminal Law
6 Article, or an offense under the laws of another state that would be a violation of §
7 14–101 of the Criminal Law Article if committed in this State.

8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
9 October 1, 2008.
