Task Force to Study Motor Vehicle Towing Practices

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force to Study Motor Vehicle Towing 4 Practices in the State; providing for the membership of the Task Force; requiring the Governor to designate the chair of the Task Force; requiring the 5 Task Force to study certain issues relevant to motor vehicle towing practices in 6 7 the State; requiring the Task Force to report its findings and recommendations 8 to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing 9 for reimbursement for expenses for a member of the Task Force; providing for 10 the staff of the Task Force; providing for the termination of this Act; and 11 generally relating to the establishment of the Task Force to Study Motor Vehicle Towing Practices in the State. 12

25 26 27	(5) issues related to notice given by a private tower to the motor vehicle owner, a secured party, an insurer, or the local police department of a towed vehicle in the possession of a private tower;
28 29	(6) issues related to State preemption of local authority governing the towing or removal of motor vehicles; and

1 (7) any other issues that the Task Force considers relevant to motor 2 vehicle towing practices in the State.

3 (g) On or before December 31, 2008, the Task Force shall report its findings 4 and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State 5 Government Article, the General Assembly.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 7 June 1, 2008. It shall remain effective for a period of 7 months <u>1 year</u> and, at the end 8 of December 31, 2008 <u>May 31, 2009</u>, with no further action required by the General 9 Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
