Criminal Law – Dogfight and Cockfight Attendance – Penalties

FOR the purpose of making it a felony to attend a dogfight or a cockfight under certain circumstances; altering the penalty for knowingly attending a deliberately conducted dogfight or a deliberately conducted event that uses a fowl, cock, or other bird to fight another fowl, cock, or other bird; and generally relating to penalties for attendance at a dogfight or a cockfight.

17 (a) A person may not knowingly attend a deliberately conducted dogfight as18 a spectator.

19 (b) A person may not knowingly attend as a spectator a deliberately 20 conducted event that uses a fowl, cock, or other bird to fight with another fowl, cock, or 21 other bird.

1 (c) (1) A person who violates this section is guilty of a [misdemeanor] 2 FELONY and on conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding [90 days] **3** 3 YEARS or a fine not exceeding [\$1,000] **\$5,000** or both.

4 (2) As a condition of sentencing, the court may order a defendant 5 convicted of violating this section to participate in and pay for psychological 6 counseling.

7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect8 October 1, 2008.
