## A BILL ENTITLED

Ethics - Complaints - Copy to Legislator

FOR the purpose of requiring the Joint Committee on Legislative Ethics to provide a copy of a complaint to the legislator who is the subject of the complaint; requiring the Joint Committee to redact the name of the complainant and other identifying information from the complaint; and generally relating to complaints filed with the Joint Committee on Legislative Ethics.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 17 (a) A complaint alleging that a member of the General Assembly may have 18 violated standards of ethical conduct, including § 2–108 of this article, may be filed 19 with the Joint Ethics Committee by:
- 20 (1) a written statement from any person, accompanied by an affidavit setting forth the facts upon which the statement is based;
- 22 (2) motion of a majority of the membership of the Joint Ethics 23 Committee; or

- 1 (3) referral of a matter to the Joint Ethics Committee by a presiding 2 officer of the General Assembly as provided in § 2–706(a)(5) of this article.
  - (b) (1) **(I)** The Joint Ethics Committee shall provide a copy of each complaint filed under subsection (a) of this section to the presiding officer of the house of the legislator who is the subject of the complaint.
  - [(2)] (II) Based on the information contained in a complaint provided to a presiding officer under [paragraph (1)] SUBPARAGRAPH (I) of this [subsection] PARAGRAPH, if a presiding officer determines that it is inappropriate for a Joint Ethics Committee member from that house to consider a particular matter, the presiding officer shall appoint a substitute member of the Joint Ethics Committee for the purposes of consideration of the matter.
- 12 (2) (I) THE JOINT ETHICS COMMITTEE SHALL PROVIDE A
  13 COPY OF A COMPLAINT FILED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION TO THE
  14 LEGISLATOR WHO IS THE SUBJECT OF THE COMPLAINT.
- 15 (II) PRIOR TO PROVIDING A COPY OF THE COMPLAINT TO
  16 THE LEGISLATOR, THE JOINT ETHICS COMMITTEE SHALL REDACT THE NAME
  17 OF THE COMPLAINANT AND ANY OTHER INFORMATION THAT IDENTIFIES THE
  18 COMPLAINANT.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2008.
