1 AN ACT concerning

2 Washington County - Purchasing Goods and Services - Public Bidding

3 FOR the purpose of raising the threshold amount at which the procurement of goods 4 and services in Washington County requires a public bidding process; providing that a certain requirement is subject to certain exceptions; authorizing the 5 6 County Commissioners of Washington County or an employee of Washington 7 County to enter into certain contracts regardless of a certain threshold amount 8 requiring a public bidding process if a contract meets certain conditions; 9 establishing that a contract of purchase or other expenditure does not need to be awarded to a certain lowest bidder under certain circumstances; and generally 10 relating to the purchasing of goods and services by the County Commissioners 11 12 of Washington County.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article 22 – Washington County

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1 Except as **OTHERWISE** provided in [subsection (d) of this section] (a) (1) $\mathbf{2}$ THIS SUBTITLE, the County Commissioners or any employee of the county may not 3 enter into any contract of sale or purchase or any contract for any county work, project, or other expenditure to which the county is a party where the amount involved 4 5 in the contract exceeds [\$25,000] **\$50,000** without advertising for bids at least 1 week 6 before the bid by publication in at least one newspaper that is published in the county 7 or through electronic media.

8 (2) NOTWITHSTANDING PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION 9 AND REGARDLESS OF WHETHER THE TOTAL CUMULATIVE PROCUREMENT 10 EXCEEDS \$50,000, IF A CONTRACT IS FOR AN INDETERMINATE AMOUNT OF 11 GOODS OR SERVICES PROCURED ON AN AS-NEEDED BASIS OVER A PERIOD OF 12 TIME, THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OR AN EMPLOYEE OF THE COUNTY MAY, 13 WITHOUT ADVERTISING FOR BIDS, ENTER INTO A CONTRACT OF PURCHASE OR A 14 CONTRACT FOR A COUNTY WORK PROJECT OR OTHER EXPENDITURE TO WHICH 15THE COUNTY IS A PARTY.

16 (b) (2) A contract of purchase or other expenditure shall be awarded to 17 the lowest responsible bidder who submits a responsive bid, **UNLESS:**

(I) THE CONTRACT OF PURCHASE OR OTHER EXPENDITURE
IS FOR THE PROCUREMENT OF PROFESSIONAL OR TECHNICAL SERVICES,
INCLUDING ARCHITECTURAL, DESIGN ENGINEERING, LEGAL, MEDICAL,
TECHNOLOGICAL, OR TECHNICAL SERVICES; AND

(II) THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS HAVE AUTHORIZED THE
AWARD OF THE CONTRACT ON THE BASIS OF THE QUALIFICATIONS, RESOURCES,
AND EXPERIENCE OF THE BIDDER, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER THE BIDDER IS
THE LOWEST BIDDER.

26 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 27 October 1, 2008.
