#### **Rosewood Center – Closure – Transfer to State Park System**

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to transfer to the Department of Natural Resources certain property known as the 4 5 Rosewood Center if the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene plans to 6 close the facility; requiring the Department of Natural Resources to include 7 certain property in the State park system on the transfer; requiring the 8 Department of Natural Resources to maintain certain property within the State park system in perpetuity unless the General Assembly approves an alternative 9 use; and generally relating to the transfer of a closed Rosewood Center to the 10 11 State park system.

# (A) IN THE EVENT OF THE PLANNED CLOSURE OF THE ENTIRE PARCEL OF PROPERTY OR A PORTION OF THE PARCEL OF PROPERTY KNOWN AS THE ROSEWOOD CENTER BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE,

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW. [Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



1THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE SHALL TRANSFER THE2PARCEL OF PROPERTY TO THE DEPARTMENT FOR INCLUSION IN THE STATE3PARK SYSTEM.

### 4 (B) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL MAINTAIN THE LAND WITHIN THE STATE 5 PARK SYSTEM IN PERPETUITY UNLESS THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY APPROVES AN 6 ALTERNATIVE USE.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
