## A BILL ENTITLED

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## State Personnel and Pensions - Contractual Employees - Health Benefits and Purchase of Service Credit

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Secretary of Budget and Management to include 5 certain State contractual employees in the types or categories of State 6 employees who are eligible to participate in the State Employee and Retiree 7 Health and Welfare Benefits Program with State subsidies under certain 8 circumstances; allowing certain members of the Employees' Retirement System 9 or Employees' Pension System to purchase a certain service credit; requiring 10 certain members of the Employees' Retirement System or Employees' Pension System who purchase certain service credit to file certain documents with the 11 Board of Trustees for the State Retirement and Pension System; providing the 12 rate at which certain service credit may be purchased; making a technical 13 14 change; and generally relating to health benefits and the purchase of service 15 credit in the Employees' Retirement System or Employees' Pension System for 16 contractual employees.

28 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:



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## 1 **Article - State Personnel and Pensions** 2 2-501.3 In this subtitle the following terms have the meanings indicated. (a) "Program" means the State Employee and Retiree Health and Welfare (b) 4 5 Benefits Program. 6 (c) "Satellite organization" means any organization or entity whose 7 employees are eligible to participate in the State Employee and Retiree Health and 8 Welfare Benefits Program as a separate account. 9 2-503.10 (a) The Secretary shall: adopt regulations for the administration of the Program; 11 (1) 12 (2)ensure that the Program complies with all federal and State laws governing employee benefit plans; and 13 14 (3)each year, recommend to the Governor the State share of the costs 15 of the Program. 16 (b) The Secretary may arrange as the Secretary considers appropriate any 17 benefit option for inclusion in the Program. 18 The Secretary shall specify by regulation the types or categories of (c) **(1)** State employees who: 19 20 are eligible to enroll and participate in the Program with [(1)](I)21 State subsidies: 22[(2)](II)are eligible to enroll and participate in the Program without 23State subsidies: and 24[(3)](III) are not eligible to enroll or participate in the Program. 25 **(2)** THE SECRETARY SHALL INCLUDE IN THE TYPES OR 26CATEGORIES OF STATE EMPLOYEES SPECIFIED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1)(I) OF 27THIS SUBSECTION CONTRACTUAL EMPLOYEES IN ALL UNITS OF THE 28 EXECUTIVE, JUDICIAL, AND LEGISLATIVE BRANCHES OF STATE GOVERNMENT,

INCLUDING ANY UNIT WITH AN INDEPENDENT PERSONNEL SYSTEM, WHO HAVE

WORKED FOR THE STATE FOR AT LEAST 6 MONTHS.

1 (d) (1)The regulations adopted by the Secretary shall include provisions for the enrollment and participation of employees of all:  $\mathbf{2}$ 3 (i) organizations and entities that were participating in the 4 Program as satellite organizations on January 1, 1993; and 5 employee organizations that qualify for payroll deductions (ii) under the provisions of § 2–403 of this title. 6 7 Employees of organizations and entities covered by this section 8 may participate: 9 (i) without State subsidies; and 10 with payment by the organization or entity of administrative (ii) costs resulting from the participation of its employees in the Program. 11 12 (3)The regulations adopted by the Secretary under this subsection shall provide that an employee organization specified in paragraph (1)(ii) of this 13 14 subsection: 15 may not enroll or participate in the Program unless the (i) organization has notified the Secretary, in writing, on or before July 1, 1994 of the 16 17 organization's intent to enroll and participate in the Program during calendar year 1994; and 18 19 may not enroll or participate in the Program on or after (ii) 20 January 1, 1995 unless the organization has participated in the Program during calendar year 1994. 2122 13–304. 23 A contractual employee who transfers to a budgeted position under this (b) subtitle or who is selected to fill a budgeted position shall become a member of the 24Employees' Pension System of the State of Maryland. 25 26 22-304.27 A member may purchase service credit as provided in subsection (b) of this section for periods of employment described in subsection (c) or (d) of this section 28 29 for which the member is not otherwise entitled to service credit. 30 (b) (1) A member who purchases service credit under this section shall:

12 13	(i) more than a total of 10 years of service credit in the Employees' Pension System;

(2)1 A member described in paragraph (1) of this subsection may  $\mathbf{2}$ purchase credit for eligibility service for that period of legislative employment by 3 paying to the Board of Trustees: 4 (i) for a period of employment on or before December 31, 1979, 5 the sum of: the amount that the member would have been 6 7 required to contribute for that period of employment; and 8 2. interest on the member's contributions, compounded 9 annually; and 10 (ii) for a period of employment on or after January 1, 1980, the 11 sum of: 12 the amount that the member would have been 1. 13 required to contribute for that period of employment; 14 2. the amount that the State would have been required 15 to contribute for the member for that period of employment; and 16 3. interest on the member's and State's contributions. 17 compounded annually. 18 (3)The rate of interest to be paid under this subsection is the average for the 5 years preceding the year of payment of the yearly rate of interest computed 19 as the sum of the investment income and the realized gains and losses divided by the 20 book value of the total investments. 21 22 A MEMBER OF THE EMPLOYEES' PENSION SYSTEM MAY **(F) (1)** 23 PURCHASE CREDIT FOR ELIGIBILITY SERVICE FOR PERIODS OF CONTRACTUAL 24 FULL-TIME EMPLOYMENT WITH THE STATE. 25 **(2)** TO PURCHASE SERVICE CREDIT UNDER THIS SUBSECTION, A 26 **MEMBER MUST:** 27 **(I)** COMPLETE A CLAIM FOR THE SERVICE CREDIT AND FILE 28IT WITH THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES ON THE FORM THAT THE BOARD OF 29 TRUSTEES PROVIDES; AND PAY TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES THE AMOUNT THAT 30 (II)31 THE MEMBER WOULD HAVE BEEN REQUIRED TO CONTRIBUTE FOR THAT PERIOD 32 OF EMPLOYMENT FOR WHICH SERVICE CREDIT IS BEING PURCHASED PLUS

INTEREST ON THE MEMBER'S CONTRIBUTIONS, COMPOUNDED ANNUALLY.

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- 1 (3) A MEMBER MAY PAY FOR SERVICE CREDIT PURCHASED 2 UNDER THIS SUBSECTION AT ANY TIME BEFORE RETIREMENT.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 4  $\,$  July 1, 2008.
