## 1 AN ACT concerning

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## **Income Tax - Credit for Providing Adult Literacy Programs**

3 FOR the purpose of allowing certain business entities a certain credit against the 4 State income tax for certain taxable years for a certain amount of the cost of 5 adult literacy services provided to an employee; limiting to a certain amount the 6 total amount of credits a business entity may claim in any taxable year; 7 providing that the credit may be refundable under certain circumstances; 8 providing for the issuance of certain initial credit certificates by the State 9 Superintendent of Schools, subject to certain requirements and limitations, for certain fiscal years; providing certain limits on the amount of credits that can be 10 claimed; requiring the State Superintendent to issue final credit certificates 11 under certain circumstances; establishing the Adult Literacy Services Tax 12 13 Credit Reserve Fund; limiting the credit amounts in the aggregate for which the State Superintendent may issue initial credit certificates for any fiscal year; 14 authorizing the Governor to include certain appropriations to a certain fund in 15 the annual budget bill for certain fiscal years; requiring the Comptroller to 16 transfer certain amounts from a certain fund to the General Fund under certain 17 circumstances; requiring the State Superintendent to submit certain reports; 18 19 requiring the State Superintendent to adopt certain regulations; defining 20 certain terms; and generally relating to a tax credit against the State income 21 tax for certain costs associated with adult literacy services.
