15 16	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 20 21	(a) (1) The provisions of this subsection do not apply if the holder of the provisional driver's license is driving while accompanied by and under the immediate supervision of an individual who:
22	(i) Is at least 21 years old;

1 2 3	(ii) Has been licensed for at least 3 years in this State or in another state to drive vehicles of the class then being driven by the holder of the provisional driver's license; and
4	(iii) Is seated beside the holder of the provisional driver's license.
5 6 7	(2) Except as provided in paragraph (3) of this subsection, a holder of a provisional driver's license who is under the age of 18 years may not drive a motor vehicle with a passenger under the age of 18 years.
8	(3) The prohibition under paragraph (2) of this subsection:
9 10	(i) Shall be in effect from the date the provisional license is originally issued until the 151st day after the provisional license was issued; and
11	(ii) Does not apply to a passenger who is:
12 13	1. A spouse, daughter, son, stepdaughter, stepson, sister, brother, stepsister, or stepbrother of the licensee; or
14 15	2. A relative of the licensee who resides at the same address as the licensee.
16 17 18	(b) [A police officer may enforce this section only as a secondary action when the police officer detains a driver for a suspected violation of another provision of the Code.
19 20	(c)] A violation of this section is a moving violation for the purposes of $\S 16-402$ of this article.
21 22 23	[(d)] (C) (1) If the Administration receives satisfactory evidence that an individual has violated this section, the Administration may suspend or revoke the individual's driver's license.
24 25	(2) An individual may request a hearing as provided for a suspension or revocation under Title 16, Subtitle 2 of this article.
26 27	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2008.
