1 AN ACT concerning

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Sustainable Energy Task Force

- FOR the purpose of establishing a Sustainable Energy Task Force; establishing the membership of the Task Force; providing for the designation of a chair of the Task Force; providing for staff for the Task Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving compensation, but authorizing certain reimbursement for certain expenses; requiring the Task Force to study and make recommendations regarding certain issues; requiring the Task Force to report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Sustainable Energy Task Force.
- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 13 MARYLAND, That:
- 14 (a) There is a Sustainable Energy Task Force.
- 15 (b) The Task Force consists of the following members:
- 16 (1) one member two members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of the Senate;
- 18 (2) one member two members of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of the House;
