- 4 FOR the purpose of altering a certain number of names of dental hygienists required 5 to be on a list from which the Governor appoints certain members to the State 6 Board of Dental Examiners; altering the composition of a certain committee on 7 dental hygiene that makes certain recommendations to the Board; repealing a 8 provision requiring a certain written agreement between certain supervising 9 dentists and certain dental hygienists in certain private dental offices; altering a certain number of months in which a dental hygienist may perform certain 10 11 dental hygiene services without a certain dentist on the premises in certain private dental offices; repealing a provision that limits the number of 12 unsupervised clinical hours certain supervised dental hygienists may work in 13 14 certain weeks in certain private dental offices; and generally relating to dental 15 hygienists.

5	(i) A licensed dentist; or
6 7	(ii) A professional corporation, partnership, limited liability company, or limited liability partnership owned and controlled by a licensed dentist.
8 9 10	(2) While it is effective, a general license to practice dental hygiene issued under this title authorizes the licensee to practice dental hygiene under the general supervision of a licensed dentist in a private dental office.
11 12	(3) A private dental office in which a dental hygienist is authorized to practice under the general supervision of a licensed dentist shall ensure that:
13 14	(i) The supervising dentist holds an active license to practice dentistry in this State;
15 16	$\ensuremath{\text{(ii)}}$ The dental hygienist holds an active license to practice dental hygiene in this State; $\ensuremath{\textbf{AND}}$
17 18	(iii) The dental hygienist has at least 1,500 hours of dental hygiene clinical practice in direct patient [care; and] CARE.

24 25	(4) A dental hygienist may perform authorized dental hygiene services without the supervising dentist on the premises only if:
26 27 28	(i) After the supervising dentist examines and evaluates a patient, the prescribed and authorized treatment to be provided by the dental hygienist is written in the patient's records;
29 30 31	(ii) 1. Treatments authorized by a supervising dentist to be provided by the dental hygienist are rendered no later than [7] 12 months from the date the patient was examined and evaluated by the supervising dentist; and

4 5	(iii) Prior to an appointment, the patient or the custodial parent or legal guardian of a minor or incompetent adult shall:
6 7 8	1. Be informed that a dental hygienist will be providing services previously prescribed by a dentist who will not be on the premises during the appointment; and
9	2. Consent to receiving the dental hygiene services;
10 11	(iv) Written emergency procedures are in place and the dental hygienist is trained to implement the emergency procedures; AND
12 13	(v) A designated licensed dentist is available for consultation with the dental [hygienist; and] HYGIENIST.
14 15 16	[(vi) The number of unsupervised clinical hours worked by a supervised dental hygienist in any given calendar week is less than 60 percent of the dental hygienist's total hours.]
17 18	(5) A supervising dentist may not employ more than two dental hygienists to work under the dentist's general supervision at any given time.
