FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission in the Maryland-Washington Regional District to consider certain information relating to existing hiking, biking, and walking trails in the Commission's review of certain proposed construction projects; requiring the Commission to communicate its reasons to certain persons if the Commission does not approve a certain proposed facility without conditions under certain circumstances; requiring the Director of Bicycle and Pedestrian Access to consult regularly with the Commission; adding a representative from the Commission to the membership of the Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee; increasing the maximum number of members of the Committee; requiring the State Highway Administration, for a project located in the Maryland-Washington Regional District, to implement a certain plan to increase safety and access for bicycle or pedestrian traffic; requiring the plan to be developed by a certain local government and in consultation with the Commission under certain circumstances; requiring the Administration to strive to construct a project in the Maryland-Washington Regional District in a manner that will utilize enhance, to the extent possible, existing major routes for pedestrian and bicycle traffic; requiring the Administration to develop certain guidelines in <del>conjunction</del> consultation with the Commission under certain circumstances; requiring sidewalks to be constructed in response to a request by the Commission; requiring each public employment facility certain
