A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Department of Housing and Community Development – Authorization of State–Funded Loan Sales – Servicing Rights for State and Bond–Funded Loans

- 5 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Housing and Community 6 Development to sell certain loans at a public or private sale, under certain 7 circumstances; authorizing the Department and the Community Development 8 Administration to retain servicing rights for certain loans after they are sold 9 and to charge a certain fee for servicing the loans; and generally relating to the 10 sale and servicing of loans by the Department of Housing and Community 11 Development and the Community Development Administration.

- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 19 Article Housing and Community Development
- 20 2–102.
- 21 The Department shall:

(1) encourage and assist political subdivisions and public and private
 community organizations to develop mutual and cooperative solutions to their common
 problems;

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1 (2) serve as a clearinghouse for information and materials that may be 2 pertinent to sound community assistance, including information on available federal, 3 State, and private financial assistance and technical assistance;

- 4 (3) implement model or demonstration programs and projects or 5 otherwise provide a program of practical research in community assistance;
- 6 (4) provide grants and loans for energy conservation and the use of 7 solar energy in commercial and residential buildings;

8 (5) provide advisory, consultative, training, and educational services, 9 and technical assistance to any political subdivision, local public agency, or nonprofit 10 organization for community assistance purposes;

(6) contract for and accept a gift, grant, contribution, or loan of money,
 property, or other aid for community assistance from a governmental unit, the federal
 government, or another source and comply with the terms and conditions of that aid;

14 (7) attach terms and conditions to financial assistance as the 15 Secretary determines;

16 (8) participate with political subdivisions, regional governments, 17 organizations, and the federal government in developing, financing, and implementing 18 a program to build the management capabilities of municipal corporations by 19 supplying needed managerial expertise through circuit riding managers;

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(9) administer federal programs to community assistance; [and]

(10) develop and implement a weatherization program in accordance
 with Title 4 of this article and administer the low-income weatherization component
 of the electric universal service program in accordance with § 7-512.1 of the Public
 Utility Companies Article; AND

(11) IF NECESSARY OR CONVENIENT TO FURTHER ANY PURPOSE
OF THE DEPARTMENT, SELL ANY MORTGAGE OR OTHER OBLIGATION THAT IT
HOLDS AT PUBLIC OR PRIVATE SALE, WITH OR WITHOUT PUBLIC BIDDING, AND
RETAIN THE SERVICING RIGHTS AND CHARGE SERVICING FEES FOR ANY
MORTGAGE OR OTHER OBLIGATION THAT IT SELLS AND APPLY THE PROCEEDS
FROM ANY SALE AND SERVICING FEES EARNED TO ANY OF THE FUNDS
ESTABLISHED BY TITLE 4, SUBTITLE 5 OF THIS ARTICLE.

33 (c) At public or private sale and with or without public bidding, the 34 Administration may sell a mortgage or other obligation that the Administration holds

AND RETAIN THE SERVICING RIGHTS AND CHARGE SERVICING FEES FOR ANY MORTGAGE OR OTHER OBLIGATION IT SELLS.

4 (g) The Administration may sell any mortgage or other obligation that it 5 holds, at public or private sale, with or without public bidding, AND RETAIN THE 6 SERVICING RIGHTS AND CHARGE SERVICING FEES FOR ANY MORTGAGE OR 7 OTHER OBLIGATION IT SELLS.
