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Town of Berwyn Heights Employees – Participation in the Employees' Pension System

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring certain employees of the Town of Berwyn Heights to 5 participate in the Employees' Pension System of the State of Maryland as of a 6 certain date; providing that membership in the Employees' Pension System is 7 optional for certain employees of the Town of Berwyn Heights; requiring certain 8 employees of the Town of Berwyn Heights to make certain elections by a certain 9 date; requiring certain employees of the Town of Berwyn Heights to complete 10 and file certain documents with the Board of Trustees of the State Retirement and Pension System by a certain date; providing for certain employees of the 11 Town of Berwyn Heights to receive service credit for certain prior service; 12 13 providing that certain employees of the Town of Berwyn Heights who become members of the Employees' Pension System after a certain date may not receive 14 15 certain service credit; and generally relating to employees of the Town of 16 Berwyn Heights participating in the Employees' Pension System.
