- 4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Board of License Commissioners of Prince George's County to issue a Class A (off-sale) beer and light wine license to 5 6 certain specialty stores; prohibiting a holder of a license to use more than a 7 certain percentage of gross floor space for the display and sale of beer and light wine; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages in Prince George's County. 8

- 19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages

22 5-101.

23 A Class A beer and light wine license shall be issued by the license (a) **(1)** issuing authority of the county in which the place of business is located. The holder of 24 25

the license may keep for sale and sell beer and light wines at retail, in any quantity to



- any consumers, at the place described in the license. The holder shall deliver the beer and light wines in a sealed package or container, which package or container may not
- 3 be opened nor its contents consumed on the premises where sold.
- 4 (r) (1) This subsection applies only in Prince George's County.
- 6 (2) [In Prince George's County the] **THE** annual license fee is \$220.
- 7 (3) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (4) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE 8 BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS MAY ISSUE A LICENSE TO:
- 9 (I) A SPECIALTY FOOD STORE THAT DOES NOT EXCEED 10 25,000 SQUARE FEET OF FLOOR SPACE;
- 11 (II) A SPECIALTY STORE THAT SELLS FOOD, BEER, WINE,
- 12 CLOTHING, FURNITURE, OR OTHER GENERAL MERCHANDISE AND THAT DOES
- 13 NOT EXCEED 50,000 SQUARE FEET OF FLOOR SPACE; OR
- 14 (III) A SPECIALTY FOOD STORE THAT EXCEEDS 100,000 15 SQUARE FEET OF FLOOR SPACE.
- 16 (4) A HOLDER OF A LICENSE FOR AN ESTABLISHMENT LISTED
 17 UNDER PARAGRAPH (3) OF THIS SUBSECTION MAY NOT USE MORE THAN 15% OF
 18 THE GROSS FLOOR SPACE FOR THE DISPLAY AND SALE OF BEER AND WINE.

- 20 (a) This section applies only in Prince George's County.
- 21(h) (1) Except as provided in [paragraph (2)] PARAGRAPHS (2) AND (3) of this subsection, an alcoholic beverage license with an off-sale privilege of any class, 22 except by way of renewal, may not be transferred or issued to any business 23 establishment of the type commonly known as chain stores, supermarkets, discount 24 houses or their franchisors and franchisees or concessionaires. However, those 25 establishments holding an alcoholic beverage license at the time of enactment of this 26 section may continue to hold such license, and may, at the discretion of the Board of 27 License Commissioners, change the classification of their license. 28
- 29 (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of this article, the Board of 30 License Commissioners may approve the transfer from the 47th alcoholic beverages 31 district to the 21st alcoholic beverages district of one Class D beer and light wine 32 license with an off–sale privilege for use by a supermarket or similar type of premises.

- 1 (3) THE BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS MAY ISSUE A 2 CLASS A BEER AND LIGHT WINE LICENSE TO A STORE LISTED UNDER § 3 5–101(R)(3) OF THIS ARTICLE.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2008.
