## Vehicle Laws - Drivers' Licenses, Identification Cards, and Moped Operator's Permits - Proof of Legal Presence

- 4 FOR the purpose of adding the presentation of certain documentation certifying that 5 an individual is either a United States citizen or is lawfully present in the 6 United States in accordance with federal law to the requirements for the 7 issuance of a driver's license, an identification card, or a moped operator's 8 permit; prohibiting the Motor Vehicle Administration from issuing a driver's 9 license to an individual who cannot provide certain documentation certifying 10 that the individual is either a United States citizen or is lawfully present in the United States in accordance with federal law; prohibiting the Administration 11 from issuing to certain individuals a driver's license, identification card, or 12 moped operator's permit that has certain effective terms; making a certain 13 14 technical correction; and generally relating to individuals who are not lawfully 15 present in the United States and the issuance of identification cards, drivers' 16 licenses, and moped operator's permits.

- 19 (1) During any period for which the individual's license to drive is 20 revoked, suspended, refused, or canceled in this or any other state, unless the 21 individual is eligible for a restricted license under § 16–113(e) of this subtitle;
- 22 (2) Who is an habitual drunkard, habitual user of narcotic drugs, or 23 habitual user of any other drug to a degree that renders the individual incapable of 24 safely driving a motor vehicle;
- 25 (3) Who previously has been adjudged to be suffering from any mental disability or mental disease and who, at the time of application, has not been adjudged competent;
- Who is required by this title to take an examination, unless the individual has passed the examination;
- 30 (5) Whose driving of a motor vehicle on the highways the 31 Administration has good cause to believe would be inimical to public safety or welfare;
- Who is unable to exercise reasonable control over a motor vehicle due to disease or a physical disability, including the loss of an arm or leg or both, except that, if the individual passes the examination required by this title, the

- 1 Passes the examination provided for in § 16-110(c)(1) of this (1)  $\mathbf{2}$ subtitle; [and] 3 Pays the fee provided for in this section; AND (2)4 **(3) PRESENTS DOCUMENTATION** ACCEPTABLE TO THE 5 ADMINISTRATION CERTIFYING THAT THE APPLICANT IS EITHER A UNITED 6 STATES CITIZEN OR IS LAWFULLY PRESENT IN THE UNITED STATES IN 7 ACCORDANCE WITH FEDERAL LAW. 8 Each application for a moped operator's permit shall be on a form and 9 contain the information that the Administration requires and each permit issued shall be of a size, design, and content that the Administration specifies. 10 11 A permit is not valid unless the applicant signs the applicant's (d) **(1)** 12 name on it in the applicant's usual signature. 13 When issued and signed, a moped operator's permit only 14 authorizes its holder to operate a moped, as defined in § 11–134.1 of this article or a 15 motor scooter, as defined in § 11–134.5 of this article. 16 (e) **(1)** [A] SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, A 17 moped operator's permit expires every 5 years. 18 **(2)** THE EFFECTIVE TERM OF A MOPED OPERATOR'S PERMIT 19 ISSUED TO AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS NOT A UNITED STATES CITIZEN BUT WHO IS 20 LAWFULLY PRESENT IN THE UNITED STATES MAY NOT EXCEED THE LENGTH OF 21TIME THAT THE INDIVIDUAL IS AUTHORIZED TO REMAIN IN THE UNITED STATES 22IN ACCORDANCE WITH FEDERAL LAW. 23 It may be renewed on application and payment of the fee required (3)24by subsection (f) of this section. 25 For issuance or renewal of a moped operator's permit, an applicant shall pay the Administration a fee established by the Administration. 26 27 (2)For issuance of a duplicate moped operator's permit, an applicant

  11 license issued under this title to a driver at least 21 years old shall expire on the birth
  12 date of the licensee in the fifth year following the issuance of the license.
- 13 (2) [A] SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (5) OF THIS SUBSECTION, A
  14 license issued under this title to a driver under the age of 21 years shall expire 60 days
  15 after the driver's 21st birthday.
- 16 (3) A license is renewable on the presentation of an application, the 17 payment of the renewal fee required by § 16–111.1 of this subtitle, and satisfactory 18 completion of the examination required or authorized by subsection (h) of this section:
  - (i) Within 6 months before its expiration; or

- 22 (4) Except as provided in subsection (e) of this section, the 23 Administration may not renew an individual's license for more than one consecutive 24 term without requiring the individual to appear in person at an office of the 25 Administration.
- 26 (5) THE EFFECTIVE TERM OF A DRIVER'S LICENSE ISSUED TO AN
  27 INDIVIDUAL WHO IS NOT A UNITED STATES CITIZEN BUT WHO IS LAWFULLY
  28 PRESENT IN THE UNITED STATES MAY NOT EXCEED THE LENGTH OF TIME THAT
  29 THE INDIVIDUAL IS AUTHORIZED TO REMAIN IN THE UNITED STATES IN
  30 ACCORDANCE WITH FEDERAL LAW.
