2 **Prince George’s County – Task Force to Study Locations in Prince George’s**
3 **County Best Suited for Use by State Agencies**

5 FOR the purpose of establishing a Task Force to Study Locations in Prince George’s
6 County Best Suited for Use by State Agencies; providing for the membership
7 and duties of the Task Force; providing for the designation of a chair of the Task
8 Force; requiring the Office of the County Executive for Prince George’s County
9 to provide staff for the Task Force; prohibiting members of the Task Force from
10 receiving compensation, but authorizing certain reimbursement for certain
11 expenses; requiring the Task Force to report its findings and recommendations
12 to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing
13 for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Task Force to

1 Study Locations in Prince George's County Best Suited for Use by State
2 Agencies.

3 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
4 MARYLAND, That:

5 (a) There is a Task Force to Study Locations in Prince George's County Best
6 Suited for Use by State Agencies.

7 (b) The Task Force consists of the following members:

8 (1) ~~three~~ two members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the
9 President of the Senate;

10 (2) ~~three~~ two members of the House of Delegates, appointed by the
11 Speaker of the House;

12 (3) one representative from the Governor's office, appointed by the
13 Governor;

14 (4) one member of the Prince George's County Council, appointed by
15 the Prince George's County Council;

16 (5) one representative from the Prince George's County Economic
17 Development Corporation, appointed by the Prince George's County Executive;

18 (6) the Prince George's County Executive, or the County Executive's
19 designee;

20 (7) one representative from the Maryland-National Capital Park and
21 Planning Commission;

22 ~~(7)~~ (8) one representative from the Board of Public Works, appointed by
23 the Governor; and

24 ~~(8)~~ (9) the Secretary of General Services, or the Secretary's designee.

25 (c) The Governor shall designate the chair of the Task Force.

26 (d) The Office of the County Executive for Prince George's County shall
27 provide staff for the Task Force.

28 (e) A member of the Task Force:

29 (1) may not receive compensation for serving on the Task Force; but

1 (2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard
2 State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.

3 (f) The Task Force shall study and make recommendations regarding:

4 (1) locations in Prince George’s County best suited for use by State
5 agencies;

6 (2) which State agencies are expected to relocate to Prince George’s
7 County; and

8 (3) methods of encouraging State agencies to relocate to Prince
9 George’s County.

10 (g) On or before September 30, 2009, the Task Force shall report its findings
11 and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State
12 Government Article, the General Assembly.

13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
14 June 1, 2008. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 4 months and, at the
15 end of September 30, 2009, with no further action required by the General Assembly,
16 this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
