4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Board of License Commissioners of Washington County to issue a caterer's license to certain alcoholic beverages licensees: 5 6 specifying the privileges conferred by the caterer's license; specifying certain 7 requirements that a holder of a caterer's license must meet; authorizing the 8 Board to issue a stadium license to certain persons; specifying the privileges 9 conferred by the stadium license and requirements to be met by a stadium license holder; authorizing the Board to issue a sidewalk café license to certain 10 11 persons; specifying the privileges conferred by a sidewalk café license; requiring the holder of a sidewalk café license to meet certain requirements; providing 12 certain fees and the hours of sale for certain licenses; defining certain terms; 13 14 making certain stylistic changes; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages 15 licenses in Washington County.

16 17 18 19	(2) The fee for such license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100) each calendar year, and shall entitle the holder to sell beer at one or more locations within the park from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. on every day from May 1 to September 30 of each year, except Sundays and election days.
20 21 22 23	(3) Such licensees shall be subject to all laws, rules and regulations applicable in [Washington the County] <b>THE COUNTY</b> to the sale of beer, not inconsistent with the provisions of this section; nothing contained in § 9–102 of this article shall apply to any license issued pursuant to this section.
