1 AN ACT concerning

Task Force to Increase the Enrollment of Students in Medicaid and the Maryland Children's Health Program

- 4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force to Increase the Enrollment of $\mathbf{5}$ Students in Medicaid and the Maryland Children's Health Program; providing for the membership of the Task Force; authorizing the Task Force to consult 6 7 with certain individuals and entities in performing its duties; requiring the Task Force to make certain recommendations; requiring the State Department 8 9 of Education to provide staff support to the Task Force; providing that members 10 of the Task Force are entitled to a certain reimbursement; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Task Force to Increase the 11 Enrollment of Students in Medicaid and the Maryland Children's Health 12 13 Program.

- 19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

23(A)THERE IS A TASK FORCE TO INCREASE THE ENROLLMENT OF24STUDENTS IN MEDICAID AND THE MARYLAND CHILDREN'S HEALTH PROGRAM.

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1	(B) THE TASK FORCE CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS:

18 19 20	(C) IN PERFORMING ITS DUTIES, THE TASK FORCE MAY CONSULT WITH INDIVIDUALS AND ENTITIES THAT THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT CONSIDERS APPROPRIATE.

23	(I) CHAIR THE TASK FORCE; AND

26 27 28	(2) TO THE EXTENT PRACTICABLE, THE MEMBERS APPOINTED TO THE TASK FORCE SHALL REASONABLY REFLECT THE GEOGRAPHIC, RACIAL, ETHNIC, CULTURAL, AND GENDER DIVERSITY OF THE STATE.
29 30	(3) IN PERFORMING ITS DUTIES, THE TASK FORCE SHALL INVITE ALL INTERESTED GROUPS TO PRESENT TESTIMONY OR OTHER INFORMATION TO

1 THE TASK FORCE CONCERNING THE ISSUES TO BE STUDIED BY THE TASK 2 FORCE.

3 (E) (1) THE TASK FORCE SHALL STUDY STRATEGIES TO MONITOR
4 AND ENSURE THAT ANY STUDENT IN A PUBLIC SCHOOL WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR
5 MEDICAID OR THE MARYLAND CHILDREN'S HEALTH PROGRAM IS ENROLLED
6 IN THE APPROPRIATE PROGRAM.

7 (2) THE TASK FORCE MAY CONSIDER STRATEGIES THAT 8 INCLUDE:

9 (I) A SINGLE APPLICATION FOR ENROLLMENT IN A FREE 10 AND REDUCED PRICE MEALS PROGRAM IN A PUBLIC SCHOOL, MEDICAID, AND 11 THE MARYLAND CHILDREN'S HEALTH PROGRAM;

12 (II) REQUIRING A PUBLIC SCHOOL TO MAIL AN 13 APPLICATION FOR ENROLLMENT IN MEDICAID OR THE MARYLAND CHILDREN'S 14 HEALTH PROGRAM TO THE PARENT OR GUARDIAN OF A STUDENT WHO IS 15 ELIGIBLE FOR A FREE AND REDUCED PRICE MEALS PROGRAM IN A PUBLIC 16 SCHOOL; AND

17 (III) REQUIRING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND 18 MENTAL HYGIENE TO REPORT TO A LOCAL HEALTH DEPARTMENT THE NAMES 19 OF STUDENTS WHO ARE ELIGIBLE FOR A FREE AND REDUCED PRICE MEALS 20 PROGRAM IN A PUBLIC SCHOOL, BUT WHO ARE NOT ENROLLED IN MEDICAID OR 21 THE MARYLAND CHILDREN'S HEALTH PROGRAM, TO ENABLE THE LOCAL 22 HEALTH DEPARTMENT TO ENGAGE IN OUTREACH TO THE PARENTS OR 23 GUARDIANS OF THOSE CHILDREN.

(F) A MEMBER OF THE TASK FORCE MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION
AS A MEMBER OF THE TASK FORCE BUT IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR
EXPENSES UNDER THE STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED
IN THE STATE BUDGET.

(G) THE TASK FORCE SHALL DEVELOP RECOMMENDATIONS ON
STRATEGIES TO INCREASE THE ENROLLMENT OF ELIGIBLE STUDENTS IN
MEDICAID AND THE MARYLAND CHILDREN'S HEALTH PROGRAM.

(H) THE TASK FORCE SHALL REPORT ITS FINDINGS AND
RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNOR AND, SUBJECT TO § 2–1246 OF THE
STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, ON OR BEFORE JULY
1, 2009.

1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 2 July 1, 2008. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June 30, 3 2010, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be 4 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
