## A BILL ENTITLED

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2	Higher Education - Janet L. Hoffman Loan Assistance Repayment Program

Higher Education – Janet L. Hoffman Loan Assistance Repayment Program – Eligibility and Administration

- FOR the purpose of expanding eligibility for the Janet L. Hoffman Loan Repayment 4 Assistance Program to individuals employed on a part-time basis; requiring 5 6 certain factors to be used in determining the amount of financial assistance 7 provided by the Office of Student Financial Assistance of the Maryland Higher 8 Education Commission to an individual participating in the Program; requiring 9 the Office to adopt regulations to establish a procedure to calculate the amount 10 of assistance provided to an eligible individual employed on a part-time basis 11 based on certain criteria; requiring the Office to adopt regulations to establish an annual review of the maximum total income for eligibility in the Program; 12 and generally relating to the Janet L. Hoffman Loan Assistance Repayment 13 14 Program.

- 20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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- 24 (a) There is a program of loan assistance repayment known as the Janet L.
- 25 Hoffman Loan Assistance Repayment Program in the State.



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- 1 Subject to the provisions of subsection (c) of this section, the Office of (b)  $\mathbf{2}$ Student Financial Assistance shall assist in the repayment of the amount of any 3 higher education loan owed by an individual who: 4 **(1)** (i) Receives a graduate, professional, or undergraduate degree 5 from: 6 1. A college or university in the State of Maryland; 7 2. A school of medicine; or 8 3. A school of law; or Receives a Resident Teacher Certificate (RTC) from the 9 (ii) 10 Department after completing an alternative teaching preparation program approved by the State Superintendent; 11 12 Obtains eligible employment, INCLUDING EMPLOYMENT ON A (2)13 PART-TIME BASIS; 14 Receives an income that is less than the maximum eligible total (3)15 income levels established by the Office, including any additional sources of income; 16 17 (4) Satisfies any other criteria established by the Office. 18 Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (b) of this section, the (c) 19 Office shall assist in the repayment of the amount of any higher education loan owed 20 by a physician who engages in primary care in the State or by a medical resident 21specializing in primary care who agrees to practice for at least 2 years as a primary 22 care physician in a geographic area of the State that has been designated by the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene as being medically underserved with the 23 funds transferred to the Office by the Comptroller under § 14–207(c)(2)(i) of the Health 24 25 Occupations Article. 26 A physician who engages in primary care is not precluded from 27 receiving assistance from the Office under subsection (b) of this section. 28 Any unspent portions of the money that is transferred to the Office 29 for use under this section from the Board of Physicians Fund may not be transferred to 30 or revert to the General Fund of the State, but shall remain in the Fund maintained by the Office to administer these programs to assist physicians engaged in primary 31 care as specified in paragraph (1) of this subsection. 32
  - (d) An applicant for assistance in the repayment of a commercial loan shall demonstrate to the Office that the commercial loan was used for tuition, educational expenses, or living expenses for graduate or undergraduate study.

- Assistance in the repayment of a loan from an entity set forth in § 1 (e) 2 18–1501(c)(2) of this subtitle shall require the approval of the Office. 3 (**f**) The Department shall employ not more than one staff member to administer the Department's portion of the Program established under this section. 4 5 18 - 1503. 6 The Office of Student Financial Assistance shall adopt regulations to (a) 7 establish: The maximum starting income for eligibility in the Janet L. 8 **(1)** Hoffman Loan Assistance Repayment Program; 9 10 The maximum total income for eligibility in the Janet L. Hoffman 11 Loan Assistance Repayment Program, including any additional sources of income: 12 (3)THAT SPOUSAL ACADEMIC DEBT AND FAMILY SIZE SHALL BE 13 FACTORS USED IN DETERMINING THE AMOUNT OF FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE 14 PROVIDED BY THE OFFICE OF STUDENT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO AN 15 INDIVIDUAL PARTICIPATING IN THE PROGRAM; 16 **(4)** That priority for participation in the Program shall be given to an 17 individual who: 18 (i) [Graduated from an institution of higher education in the 19 last 3 years; 20 (ii)Is a resident of the State; 21 [(iii)]**(II)** Is employed on a full-time basis; and 22 [(iv)](III)Provides, as the principal part of the individual's employment, legal services to low income residents in the State who cannot afford 2324 legal services, nursing services in nursing shortage areas in the State as defined in § 18–802 of this title, or other services in an eligible field of employment in which there 25 26 is a shortage of qualified practitioners to low income or underserved residents or areas of the State: 27 28 [(4)] (5) A limit on the total amount of assistance provided by the 29 Office of Student Financial Assistance in repaying the loan of an eligible individual,
  - (6) A PROCEDURE FOR THE CALCULATION OF THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF ASSISTANCE PROVIDED BY THE OFFICE OF STUDENT FINANCIAL

based on the individual's total income and outstanding higher education loan balance;

- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2008.
