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Public Health - Task Force Committee on Childhood Obesity

- FOR the purpose of establishing a Task Force Committee on Childhood Obesity to provide certain advice and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on certain issues; specifying the membership, terms, chairman, and staff of the Task Force Committee; requiring the Task Force Committee to issue a certain report on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Task Force Committee on Childhood Obesity.
