A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Public Health Work Group – Hospital Preparedness – Snakebite Antivenin

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to 4 convene a work group to assess the level of hospital preparedness regarding 5 providing emergency care to patients with snakebites requiring the 6 administration of antivenin and to make certain recommendations; providing 7 for the composition of the work group; requiring the Department to provide staff 8 for the work group; requiring the Department to submit a certain report to 9 certain committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date; 10 providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to a work group assessing hospital preparedness for snakebite care. 11

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 13 MARYLAND, That:

14 (a) The Department of Health and Mental Hygiene shall convene a work 15 group to:

16 (1) assess the availability of snakebite antivenin in hospital 17 emergency departments across the State;

18 (2) assess in a timely manner the level of hospital preparedness
19 regarding the treatment of patients who have been bitten by poisonous snakes; and

20 (3) develop recommendations to improve the system of care for 21 patients who have snake bites that require the timely administration of antivenin.

- 22 (b) The work group shall consist of representatives from:

$13 \\ 14 \\ 15 \\ 16$	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2008. It shall remain effective for a period of 7 months and, at the end of December 31, 2008, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
