## Vehicle Laws – Failure to Yield Right–of–Way – Penalties for Death or Serious Bodily Injury

- 4 FOR the purpose of establishing that if a person fails to yield the right-of-way in 5 violation of certain provisions of law and the violation contributes to an accident 6 that results in the death or serious bodily injury of another, the person is 7 subject to a certain fine and the Motor Vehicle Administration is authorized to 8 suspend the person's license for a certain period of time; providing that a 9 licensee may request a hearing on a license suspension imposed under this Act; and generally relating to penalties for a failure to yield the right-of-way that 10 contributes to an accident that results in death or serious bodily injury. 11

2 (A) IF A PERSON VIOLATES ANY PROVISION OF TITLE 21, SUBTITLE 4 3 OF THIS ARTICLE AND THE VIOLATION CONTRIBUTES TO AN ACCIDENT THAT 4 RESULTS IN THE DEATH OR, AS DEFINED IN § 27–113 OF THIS SUBTITLE, 5 SERIOUS BODILY INJURY OF ANOTHER, THE PERSON IS GUILTY OF A 6 MISDEMEANOR AND ON CONVICTION:

7 (1) THE PERSON IS SUBJECT TO A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN 8 \$1,000; AND

9 (2) THE ADMINISTRATION MAY SUSPEND THE PERSON'S LICENSE 10 FOR NOT MORE THAN 180 DAYS.

(B) SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF TITLE 12, SUBTITLE 2 OF THIS
ARTICLE, A LICENSEE MAY REQUEST A HEARING ON A LICENSE SUSPENSION
IMPOSED UNDER THIS SECTION.
