14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

(a) Without the permission of the owner, a person may not [enter or be on
the premises of another, and] take and carry away from the premises or out of the
custody **OF ANOTHER** or use of the other, or the other's agent, or a governmental unit
