A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services – Employees Serving as Members of County Governing Bodies

FOR the purpose of providing that an individual employed by the Department of
Correctional Services in a certain capacity is not prohibited from serving in a
certain elective office; requiring the Secretary of Correctional Services, in
consultation with the State Ethics Commission, to adopt certain regulations;
and generally relating to conflicts of interest and limitations on employment.

- 19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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$1 \\ 2 \\ 3$	(a) (1) Employment by the State does not affect any right or obligation of a citizen under the Constitution and laws of the United States or under the Constitution and laws of the State.
4 5	(2) Except as otherwise provided in this section or by federal law, a State employee:
$6 \\ 7$	(i) may freely participate in any political activity and express any political opinion; and
8	(ii) may not be required to provide any political service.
9 10 11	(b) Notwithstanding any other law of the State effective on or before June 30, 1973, the restrictions imposed by subsection (c) of this section are the only restrictions on the political activities of an employee, except for:

19	(a) The Secretary shall adopt regulations for the office of the Secretary.
$20 \\ 21$	(b) (1) The Secretary shall review regulations proposed by a unit in the Department.

24 25 26 27	(c) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, the Secretary shall adopt regulations to govern the policies and management of correctional facilities in the Division of Correction in accordance with Title 10, Subtitle 1 of the State Government Article.
28 29 30	(2) Paragraph (1) of this subsection does not apply to a guideline pertaining to the routine internal management of correctional facilities in the Division of Correction.
31 32 33 34	(3) (i) Subject to subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, the Secretary shall adopt regulations that provide for a requirement that a correctional officer hired on or after October 1, 2007, for employment in any unit of the Division of Correction shall be at least 21 years old.

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1 (ii) The regulations adopted under subparagraph (i) of this 2 paragraph shall exempt any honorably discharged veteran or reserve member of the 3 United States armed forces from the minimum age requirement.

4 (D) (1) NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF §§ 15–502 THROUGH 5 15–504 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, AN INDIVIDUAL EMPLOYED BY 6 THE DEPARTMENT IN A COUNTY FIELD OFFICE ADMINISTERED BY THE 7 DEPARTMENT IS NOT PROHIBITED FROM SERVING IN AN ELECTIVE OFFICE ON 8 THE GOVERNING BODY OF THAT COUNTY.

9 (2) THE SECRETARY, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE STATE 10 ETHICS COMMISSION, SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO GOVERN CONFLICTS OF 11 INTEREST WITH RESPECT TO EMPLOYMENT BY INDIVIDUALS IN A COUNTY FIELD 12 OFFICE ADMINISTERED BY THE DEPARTMENT WHILE ALSO SERVING IN AN 13 ELECTIVE OFFICE ON THE GOVERNING BODY OF THAT COUNTY.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectOctober 1, 2008.
