CHAPTER AN ACT concerning **Public Health Dental Hygiene Act** FOR the purpose of altering the authorization of a general license to practice dental hygiene to include the application of certain sealants or fluoride agents under certain supervision in certain facilities; providing that a certain waiver is not required to practice dental hygiene under certain supervision in accordance with certain provisions of law; increasing the types of facilities a general license to practice dental hygiene authorizes a dental hygienist to practice in under certain supervision; altering the requirements for certain facilities in which certain dental hygienists are authorized to practice under certain supervision;
