- FOR the purpose of altering the authorization of a general license to practice dental 3 4 hygiene to include the application of certain sealants or fluoride agents under 5 certain supervision in certain facilities; providing that a certain waiver is not 6 required to practice dental hygiene under certain supervision in accordance 7 with certain provisions of law; increasing the types of facilities a general license 8 to practice dental hygiene authorizes a dental hygienist to practice in under 9 certain supervision; altering the requirements for certain facilities in which certain dental hygienists are authorized to practice under certain supervision; 10 11 defining a certain terms; and generally relating to the practice of dental 12 hygiene.
