3 (2) “Advisory Council” means the Advisory Council on Workforce  
4 Shortage.

5 (3) “Eligible institution” means a public or private institution of higher  
6 education in this State that possesses a certificate of approval from the Commission.

7 (4) “Grant” means the Workforce Shortage Student Assistance grant.

8 (5) “Public good or benefit” means service to low-income or underserved  
9 residents or areas of the State in an occupation in the public sector or in an  
10 organization, institution, association, society, or corporation that is exempt from  
11 taxation under § 501(c)(3) or (4) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.

12 (b) There is a program of Workforce Shortage Student Assistance grants  
13 under this section for students who pledge to work in fields of critical shortage in the  
14 State on completion of their studies.

15 (c) The purpose of the program is to:

16 (1) Provide financial assistance to students enrolled at institutions of  
17 higher education in the State; and

18 (2) Address the workforce shortage needs of the State.

19 (d) A recipient of a Workforce Shortage Student Assistance grant under this  
20 section shall:

21 (1) Be a resident of the State;

22 (2) Be selected by the Office from qualified applicants;

23 (3) Sign a letter of intent to enroll at an eligible institution in the State  
24 in an eligible program as specified for each field in which there is a critical shortage in  
25 this State as provided in this section;

26 (4) Sign a letter of intent to perform the service obligation on  
27 completion of the recipient’s required studies;

28 (5) Accept any other conditions attached to the grant;

29 (6) Satisfy any additional criteria the Commission may establish; and

1           (7) After completion of studies in an eligible program, perform the  
2 service obligation as specified for each field in which there is a critical shortage, as  
3 provided in this section.

4           (e) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (5) of this subsection, the  
5 Commission shall on a biennial basis:

6                   (i) Identify workforce shortage fields in the State;

7                   (ii) Designate eligible workforce shortage fields under the grant  
8 program; and

9                   (iii) Remove from the grant program any field that the  
10 Commission determines no longer qualifies as a workforce shortage.

11           (2) The Secretary shall appoint an Advisory Council on Workforce  
12 Shortage to:

13                   (i) Identify workforce shortage fields in the State; and

14                   (ii) Recommend to the Commission:

15                           1. Priority workforce shortage fields to be included in the  
16 grant program; and

17                           2. The removal of fields that in the Advisory Council's  
18 judgment no longer qualify as workforce shortage fields.

19           (3) In making recommendations to the Commission, the Advisory  
20 Council shall consider whether a workforce shortage field provides a public good or  
21 benefit to the citizens of Maryland.

22           (4) The Advisory Council shall include the following members:

23                   (i) The Secretary of Higher Education or designee;

24                   (ii) The Secretary of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation or  
25 designee;

26                   (iii) One representative from the Governor's Workforce Investment  
27 Board, appointed by the Governor;

28                   (iv) The Secretary of Business and Economic Development or  
29 designee;

30                   (v) The Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene or designee;

- 1                    (vi) The State Superintendent of Schools or designee;
- 2                    (vii) One representative of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by  
3 the President of the Senate;
- 4                    (viii) One representative of the Maryland House of Delegates,  
5 appointed by the Speaker of the House;
- 6                    (ix) Two representatives from the University System of Maryland,  
7 appointed by the Chancellor;
- 8                    (x) The President of Morgan State University or designee;
- 9                    (xi) The President of St. Mary's College or designee; and
- 10                   (xii) Representatives nominated by the following organizations  
11 and appointed by the Secretary of Higher Education:
- 12                    1. One representative from the Maryland Chamber of  
13 Commerce;
- 14                    2. One representative from the Washington Board of  
15 Trade;
- 16                    3. One representative from the Greater Baltimore  
17 Committee;
- 18                    4. Two representatives from the Maryland Independent  
19 College and University Association;
- 20                    5. Two representatives from the Maryland Association of  
21 Community Colleges;
- 22                    6. One representative from the Maryland Association of  
23 Nonprofit Associations; and
- 24                    7. One representative from the Financial Assistance  
25 Advisory Council representing a financial aid office at an institution of higher  
26 education.
- 27                    (5) (i) Except as provided in subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph,  
28 the following workforce shortage fields shall be included in the grant program:
- 29                    1. School teachers (the grant to be known as the Sharon  
30 Christa McAuliffe Memorial Teacher Scholarship);
- 31                    2. Nurses;



1           (1) May be enrolled at an eligible institution on a part-time or  
2 full-time basis;

3           (2) Shall earn at least 12 undergraduate or 9 graduate credit hours in  
4 each academic year, including summer sessions;

5           (3) Except as provided in paragraph (4) of this subsection, shall be an  
6 undergraduate student at an eligible institution; and

7           (4) May be a graduate student if the Office determines that the shortage  
8 field requires employees with a graduate level education.

9           (i) (1) In this subsection, "cost of attendance" means the equivalent annual  
10 tuition and mandatory fees of a resident undergraduate student at the 4-year public  
11 institution of higher education within the University System of Maryland, other than  
12 the University of Maryland University College and University of Maryland, Baltimore,  
13 with the highest annual expenses for a full-time resident undergraduate.

14           (2) Subject to paragraphs (3), (4), and (5) of this subsection, the  
15 Commission shall establish in guidelines the annual grant awards under this section.

16           (3) Annual grant awards shall be within the following ranges:

17                   (i) For a part-time student attending a 2-year eligible  
18 institution – \$1,000 and 12.5% of cost of attendance;

19                   (ii) For a full-time student attending a 2-year eligible institution  
20 – \$2,000 and 25% of cost of attendance;

21                   (iii) For a part-time student attending a 4-year eligible  
22 institution – \$2,000 and 25% of cost of attendance; and

23                   (iv) For a full-time student attending a 4-year eligible institution  
24 – \$4,000 and 50% of cost of attendance.

25           (4) For a student taking courses during a summer session to meet the  
26 minimum number of credit hours for full-time or part-time status, the Commission  
27 shall distribute grant awards to the student in the spring and summer sessions in  
28 amounts it determines to be appropriate.

29           (5) A student who is enrolled in an academic program that includes a  
30 mandatory summer academic session as part of the approved curriculum may receive  
31 an additional award not to exceed \$1,000 per calendar year.

1           (j) The grant award may be used at any eligible institution for educational  
2 expenses as defined by the Commission, including tuition, mandatory fees, and room  
3 and board.

4           (k) (1) A grant recipient shall perform a service obligation in the recipient's  
5 field of critical shortage in:

6                       (i) A full-time position at a rate of 1 year for each year that the  
7 recipient receives a grant awarded under this section; or

8                       (ii) A part-time position at a rate of 2 years for each year that the  
9 recipient receives a grant awarded under this section.

10           (2) The Commission may establish alternative service obligation  
11 requirements for designated workforce shortage fields to address statewide and  
12 regional needs.

13           (l) (1) A grant recipient shall repay the Commission the funds received as  
14 set forth in § 18-112 of this title if the recipient does not:

15                       (i) Earn at least 12 undergraduate or 9 graduate credit hours in  
16 each academic year in which the student receives assistance, including summer  
17 sessions;

18                       (ii) Complete the specified degree, attain the licensure or  
19 certification required, or fulfill other requirements as provided in this section; or

20                       (iii) Perform the service obligation required under subsection (k)  
21 of this section.

22           (2) The Office shall waive the repayment of a grant award at a rate of:

23                       (i) 1 year for each year that the recipient performs the service  
24 obligation on a full-time basis; or

25                       (ii) 6 months for each year that the recipient performs the service  
26 obligation on a part-time basis.

27           (3) A recipient shall begin repayment at any time during the period  
28 that the recipient is no longer performing the service obligation.

29           (4) A recipient may delay repayment as long as the recipient remains a  
30 student enrolled at least part-time in a degree-granting program.

31           (5) Except as otherwise provided in this section, repayment shall be  
32 made to the State within 6 years after the repayment period begins and shall follow a  
33 repayment schedule established by the Office.

1           (6) The Office may waive or defer repayment in the event of disability  
2 or extended sickness which prevents the recipient from fulfilling the service obligation  
3 required under this section.

4           (7) The Office shall grant a deferment from the service obligation  
5 required under this section to:

6                   (i) An individual who has been assigned military duty outside  
7 the State; or

8                   (ii) The spouse of an individual who has been assigned military  
9 duty outside the State.

10           (m) (1) This subsection applies to recipients of the William Donald Schaefer  
11 Scholarship specified in subsection (e)(5) of this section.
