- FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from failing to ensure that certain messages relating to a candidate, campaign, or political committee meet certain requirements; prohibiting a person from sending a certain message that does not contain certain information; providing for certain penalties for a willful and knowing violation of the requirements of this Act; defining certain terms; and

- 4 (B) A PERSON MAY NOT FAIL TO ENSURE THAT AN ARTIFICIAL TELEPHONE MESSAGE OR A PRERECORDED TELEPHONE MESSAGE RELATING TO A CANDIDATE, A PROSPECTIVE CANDIDATE, OR THE APPROVAL OR REJECTION OF A QUESTION DURING OR AFTER THE MESSAGE, STATES CLEARLY THE INFORMATION CONTAINED IN AN AUTHORITY LINE AS REQUIRED UNDER § 13–401 OF THIS ARTICLE.
- 10 (C) A PERSON WHO WILLFULLY AND KNOWINGLY VIOLATES THIS
  11 SECTION SHALL BE SUBJECT TO THE CIVIL PENALTY PROVISIONS OF THE
  12 MARYLAND TELEPHONE CONSUMER PROTECTION ACT.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2008.
