- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 14 Article Election Law
- 15 10–310.
- 16 (a) For each individual who seeks to vote, an election judge, in accordance with instructions provided by the local board, shall:
- 18 (1) locate the individual's name in the precinct register and locate the preprinted voting authority card and then authorize the individual to vote a regular ballot;
