## A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning

## Landlord and Tenant - Eviction - Abandoned Chattels

FOR the purpose of providing that certain chattels that remain on property repossessed by a landlord shall be presumed abandoned under certain circumstances; providing that a landlord or a landlord's agent may not be liable for any loss or damage to abandoned chattels; authorizing a landlord to dispose of abandoned chattels by certain means; and generally relating to removal of a tenant's chattels from property repossessed by a landlord.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
Article - Real Property

8-405.
(A) ALL FURNITURE, IMPLEMENTS, TOOLS, GOODS, EFFECTS, OR ANY OTHER CHATTELS BELONGING TO A TENANT OR TO ANY PERSON CLAIMING OR HOLDING BY OR UNDER THE TENANT THAT REMAIN ON PROPERTY REPOSSESSED BY THE LANDLORD UNDER § 8-401 OR § 8-402 OF THIS SUBTITLE WHEN THE WARRANT OF RESTITUTION IS EXECUTED SHALL BE PRESUMED ABANDONED.

(B) A LANDLORD OR A LANDLORD'S AGENT IS NOT LIABLE FOR ANY LOSS OR DAMAGE TO ABANDONED CHATTELS.

8-406.

A LANDLORD OR A LANDLORD'S AGENT MAY DISPOSE OF ABANDONED CHATTELS BY:
(1) TRANSPORTING THE ABANDONED CHATTELS TO A REFUSE DISPOSAL SYSTEM, AS DEFINED IN § 9-201 OF THE ENVIRONMENT ARTICLE;
(2) DONATING THE ABANDONED CHATTELS TO A CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION; OR
(3) OTHER LEGAL MEANS.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2008.
