## Patient Referrals for Radiation Therapy Services

- FOR the purpose of repealing radiation therapy services from the services not included in the definition of in-office ancillary services of health care professionals under the laws relating to patient referrals; providing that certain prohibitions on referrals do not apply to referrals for certain radiation therapy services; and generally relating to patient referrals for radiation therapy.

  - (d) "Direct supervision" means a health care practitioner is present on the premises where the health care services or tests are provided and is available for consultation within the treatment area.
- "Faculty practice plan" means a tax exempt organization established 6 7 under Maryland law by or at the direction of a university to accommodate the 8 professional practice of members of the faculty who are health care practitioners.
- 9 "Group practice" means a group of two or more health care practitioners legally organized as a partnership, professional corporation, foundation, not-for-profit 10 corporation, faculty practice plan, or similar association: 11
- In which each health care practitioner who is a member of the (1) group provides substantially the full range of services which the practitioner routinely provides through the joint use of shared office space, facilities, equipment, and 14 15 personnel:
